

Tuilleries will be led by M. Pas Loup. An electric light will be shown in the fountains playing in the Palace de la Concordia. The place of the Municipal Council will be brilliantly decorated, illuminated and eschutched with republican shields. The Arc de Triomphe will be the scene of brilliant pyrotechnics. One piece representing the Statue of the Republic, at a cost of 30,000 francs. The fountains of each corner will be visible from many leagues. Other points for the display of fireworks will be Mont Martre, Fontaines de Chaumont, the Pantheon, Bois de Boulogne and Place du Louvre. On the latter will be exhibited a piece representing the Bastille, which will tumble down, and on the ruins will rise a July column in the Genius of Liberty. Forty thousand delegates from the country communes will be housed by the officials of the city and arrondissement. The government seems disposed to suspend the execution of the anti-religious decrees until the legal tribunals have decided on the case of the Jesuits. The question of jurisdiction is still to be heard before the Tribunal of Disconflicts, a mixed body, composed of a Judge and members of the Council of State, under the presidency of the Minister of Justice.
