## Supplementary Report.

A report has already been given to you and an award made on silver ores exhibited by the Ontario Company. They are high grade sulphides chiefly, assaying from 200 ounces to 1,000 ounces of silver per ton. When roasted they are exceedingly interesting as a metallic sponge consisting of silver with some gold. There is a friable black ore from the 500 feet level assaying 400 ounces silver; a free milling ore, assaying 200 ounces silver; and

several valuable specimens besides those reported on.

Messrs. Morris & Evans with their usual promptitude have brought together a large collection of utilities; fire clay and fire brick, plaster of Paris for common plastering purposes or fine art use, as for dentists; gypsum, also phosphates for fertilizing purposes, bone ash for cupel work, and pulverized silica, with complete fitting for furnaces, specimens of scagliola, marble, polished slate, etc., for which exhibition a bronze medal is awarded.

Mr. Jeremiah Gibson deserves honorable mention for home manufactures in bath brick and u-s-u polishing powders.

Mr. Mark Lindsey exhibited fine specimens of Jaspers wood from Southern Utah, also specimens of opal, silica, etc., from petrified trees.
