An Aged Sister Gone.—News has reached us of the death of Sister Catharine Wilson, more commonly known as "Grandmother Wilson," who departed this life on the 25th ult., at the ripe old age of 95 years.

Sister Wilson was born April 15, 1782, at Merionethshire, North Wales; received the gospel in the fall of 1840, in Finland, and emigrated to Nauvoo in 1842. She crossed the plains to Utah with Bishop N. K. Whitney's family, and drove a light wagon all the way. From that time she has resided in Utah, and after a long and useful life, has quietly gone to rest, to await the final resurrection, when she will come forth with the just and the faithful, to receive the reward of all her well doing.

The remains were placed in the Ogden City cemetery, Dec. 30, 1878.
