Nelson Closing At Denver.

DENVER, Feb. 18.—In accordance with the terms of the agreement card rendered on Friday that the State had a right to close the saloons in the city, the Denver saloons, in places, with one or two exceptions, where the liquor is sold in restaurants, and where the saloons are small and they will be closed until Monday morning. A Brooklyn Tramp.

New York, Feb. 18.—Isaac Jacobs, resident of Brooklyn, killed Herman Hogenstadt, at day-
