NEW YORK, Sept. 10.—228 p.m.—  
Valkyrie won, crossing the line at  
10:49 p.m.; Defender 2 minutes 11  
seconds later.Sanday Lightship, Sept. 10.—Both  
yachts are standing about Sandy Hook  
lightship. Wind N.E. and about six  
miles. Valkyrie has her jib, mainail  
and cross-topsail set. Defender has her  
jib, mainail, cross-topsail and foretop  
set.Highlands, 10:38 a.m.—Valkyrie has  
her jib, mainail and cross-topsail set.

of yacht and steamer is the largest  
ever seen.Highlands, 10:38 a.m.—Wind is due  
with prospect of increasing.Sanday Lightship.—The boats are  
maneuvering for the start of Sandy  
Hook lightship.Sanday Lightship, 11 a.m.—The  
preliminary signal is just set.Lightship.—Valkyrie crossed the  
line nearly after the ten-minute start  
and the Defender barely saved the two  
minutes over the Valkyrie, finishing in  
a windward position.Highlands.—Sixteen seconds before  
the starting gun, Valkyrie's boat  
crossed the line, the Defender continued  
on its way to windward and crossing  
the limit line gun was received. After  
crossing, Valkyrie led slightly but  
Defender is rapidly closing the gap.The points are now standing to the  
westward of the lightship. The start  
was made at exactly 11 o'clock and forty seconds. Defender  
is now rapidly closing on Valkyrie. As  
both boats are going directly from me,  
I am unable to see the results.Highlands.—Official time Valkyrie  
had first 10:57:40; Defender 10:58:12.  
Highlands, 10:40 p.m.—Both boats  
are 2 miles ahead.10:40 p.m.—McLean can't find of excursion  
boat off the east, but no sign of the  
yacht or boat off shore.10:40 p.m.—Defender's behavior is  
better thanesterday; they are keeping  
station and to leeward of the race.The yachts were about on the starboard  
tack, Valkyrie slightly in the lead.10:40 p.m.—Valkyrie about an eighth of  
a mile to the lead.10:40 p.m.—Valkyrie leads by 100  
yards. Defender rapidly closing the gap.  
The station boats are right on top of them.10:40 p.m.—The yachts, which had  
been running on the port tack since  
the start, went about on the starboard  
tack, Valkyrie to leeward and the port  
tack.10:40 p.m.—Valkyrie appears ahead  
in the open water shows. Valkyrie  
easily in the lead passing here, but  
not closing the gap.10:40 p.m.—Defender's tactics, closely  
followed by Valkyrie, Valkyrie  
gaining slightly on Defender. Valkyrie  
will have the windward position  
and appears to be a quarter of a mile  
off the lead. As the yachts are going  
straight from me, it is hard to distin-10:40 p.m.—Still on the starboard tack  
leading southwest, Valkyrie leading  
a triangle of 100 yards. Still 100 yards  
apart. Both boats have gone about six miles on  
the leg.10:40 p.m.—Defender seems to be  
crossing her position and is gaining  
slightly.10:40 p.m.—Valkyrie seems to hold  
her lead. Both boats seem to have a  
good breeze.10:40 p.m.—Both on the starboard  
tack, seem to be in the same position  
Valkyrie leading.Highlands, 10:40 p.m.—Valkyrie  
seems to be pulling a little away from  
Defender, and while not pointing as  
high as yesterday, is holding apparently little faster.10:40 p.m.—Valkyrie has just come  
about on the starboard tack. Defender  
followed suit directly in her wake, fin-

sailing closer to the wind than Valkyrie.

10:40 p.m.—Both yachts are holding  
on the port tack.10:40 p.m.—Defender seems to have  
dropped a little in the last few minutes  
but Valkyrie has the lead about  
three-eighths of a mile.

Highlands.—Valkyrie crossed the line

at 10:38:20 p.m.—Defender

about a minute behind Valkyrie.

Highlands, 10:38 p.m.—Both

yachts were by about two minutes

and eleven seconds lapsed time, un-

official.

Long Branch, 10:38 p.m.—The star-

boat has taken up her position off this

shore. Valkyrie has been leading since

leaving the harbor recently and now

appears to head the imagined

yacht.

Mackay-Bennett, 10:41 p.m.—De-

fender seems to be moving to the west

about a quarter of a mile astern.

The yachts have now

crossed the line.

Highlands, 10:41 p.m.—Defender is

already out in front and only about

a quarter of a mile astern.

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
