It cer-miny is an unwise policy, under the cir-cumstances, to place it in the hands of those who will take it out of the country. A arge amount of capital has been inrested in machinery and buildings and a great many hands are employed in this manufacture, and it is no more than right that manufacturers should receive the

rdial support of the community. There or not the excuse that formerly existed for not patronizing home-manufactured woolen goods. In former days, under primitive methods, they were thought mare and unfinished; but now they compare very favorably with the best fastern manufactured goods in their line; and, in fact, are admitted to be superior by good judges of cloth. 


