FIRE INSURANCE DILEMMA

Companies Believe Huntsville School Building Fire Largely Due to Carelessness.

Petty Legal Fight Over a Receipt for Money-High School Program-Farr-Reeder Nuptials.

A complaint was sworn out before Justice Joseph Hall by Thomas Evans against C. Street, manager of the Ogden branch of the Singer Sewing Machine company, charging him with stealing and carrying away a receipt in full for a sewing machine purchased by the plaintiff from the defendant. A warrant was placed in the hands of Offleer Hutchins for the arrest of Mr. Street, but the gentleman was out of own, being at Logan, on business for

the company. The facts in the case, as near as can ascertained are that Mrs. Evans bought a machine from the company and paid part on the same; later Mr. Evans called at the office and asked what the balance due on his account amounted to, and in figuring it up mistake of \$10.00 was made by the com-pany; instead of the bookkeeper making the balance due \$37,00 as it is said it really was, they made it \$27,00. When the mistake was observed, Mr. Street went to the Evans home and secured the receipt which had been given in mistake, explaining the same, and gave another receipt, showing a balance of \$10 due. Mr. Evans claims that he paid the bill in full and got a receipt for the same, Later Mr. Street went to the Eyans home and got the receipt and Mr. Evans, being unable to get the original receipt back, has commenced the proceedings.

INSURANCE ON HUNTSVILLE SCHOOL.

The insurance companies who held the insurance on the Huntsville school house, which was burned down Tuesday, it is reported, are going to make an investigation as to the cause of the fire, and may refuse to pay a full in-surance on the losses sustained by the destruction of the building. According to reports the building has not been cared for as it should have been, and the chimney was allowed to get out of order and clog up to such an extent that several times of late the school has had to be closed on account of the smoke coming into the school room, but the flue was permitted to remain in this dilapidated condition to the knowledge of the school trustees. It is, therefore, understood that the insurance companies interested will contend that the flue should have been re-
