

TRUTH AND LIBERTY. BY TELEGRAPH. EASTERN. YONK-Dead. New York, 11.—Two petitions are being circulated for signature, asking Congress to repeal the Shipping Act. One purports to be on behalf of the owners, merchants and masters of American vessels, and prays for repeal on the ground that their rights to make private contracts should not be interfered with by the government; the other purports to proceed from the mariners of the port of New York. Both state the general objections to the bill, which have been already published by the opponents of the Act. Strong personal opposition is manifested to Capt. Duncan, who is alleged to have introduced and carried the system with an eye to his private interest.

Aid for Memphis. Heint Bros. have received from the citizens of San Francisco two thousand dollars in gold for Memphis.

Wall Street Very Uneasy. There has been more or less excitement in Wall street, attended with great depression of the Stock Exchange. This condition of affairs has been brought about by the advance in the Bank of England rates, additional banking, stock and mercantile failures, and difficulty in securing money in large amounts, and it was these forced sales which were the cause of the depression.

Shipwreck and Loss of Life. PORTLAND, Me., 14.—The schooner, R. T. Warner, foundered, the crew, of sixteen, were lost.

Ravages Continue. MEMPHIS, 14.—The mortality here for the past twenty-four hours shows sixty-one deaths from yellow fever.

Reformer Elected. NEWARK, N.J.—The charter election resulted in the election of Perry, Dem. and reform candidate, by 179 majority.

FOREIGN. GREAT BRITAIN. Discount Advanced. LONDON, 14.—The bank rate of discount was advanced to-day, in consequence of heavy orders for the aggregate of three million dollars.

Spain. Madrid, 14.—The insurgents of Carthage attribute the defeat of their squadron solely to the cowardice of Carthage, who ordered the retreat against the wishes of the crews. They declare that he will not be suffered to command a fleet again. Three vessels sailed out of the harbor to-day for a second fight, but finding the government fleet prepared for action they retired.
