

Dynamite, with Fuse and Caps, Found on N.P. Tracks Near Butte

Built, Mont., Oct. 3.—Dan Gilmore, an Immate of the county poor farm, found a stick of dynamite on the Northern Pacific tracks near Burte this morning. A fuse and caps were attached. He removed the explosive in time to prevent the wreck of the North Coast limited, the fast passen-ger train of the road, which was almost due.
