By arbitrarily compelling him to take sil-rand declared to be of equal value, and so treated in the payments by the Treasury, would not such ac-tion on the part of the Secretary of the treasury tend to discredit silver, and would he not be derelict in his duty, which required him to do all that was in his power to do to maintain the three kinds of money on a pa-rity?
