

## PRINCE HENRY'S TOUR IS OVER.

He Returns to New York, Where  
He Remains Until Monday.

### EXPRESSES SATISFACTION.

Captain von Mueller Issues a State-  
ment—His Highness Values Very  
Much the Hearty Welcomes.

New York, March 7.—Prince Henry of Prussia today completed his tour of the United States, where he was a guest of the United States government. He will remain in New York until Monday, when he will go to Philadelphia. He was absent from the city for nine days, during which time his special train was with him in the territory of thirteen states and a total distance of 4,328 miles. He was greatly pleased with his trip and tonight, through his aide, Captain von Mueller, issued a statement expressing his satisfaction at the opportunity which came to him and his gratification at the cordiality with which he was received throughout the country. Captain von Mueller said:

"His royal highness is very much pleased by his trip into the interior of the United States. He is fully aware of the fact that he had had only a superficial glimpse of a very small portion of the United States, and that he might perhaps have used his time to greater advantage had he remained in one of the larger cities of the east."

"But he is convinced, nevertheless, that considering the characteristics of his mission, the trip was the right thing for him to do. In making it he has obtained a very fair idea of the vastness of the country and its resources, which the capital of the United States and the great commercial centers of the east alone could not have given him."

"But more than this impression he values the hearty welcomes which he met in all the places he went through. A welcome that showed him how the people of the United States everywhere understood and appreciated the intentions of the German emperor in sending him here."

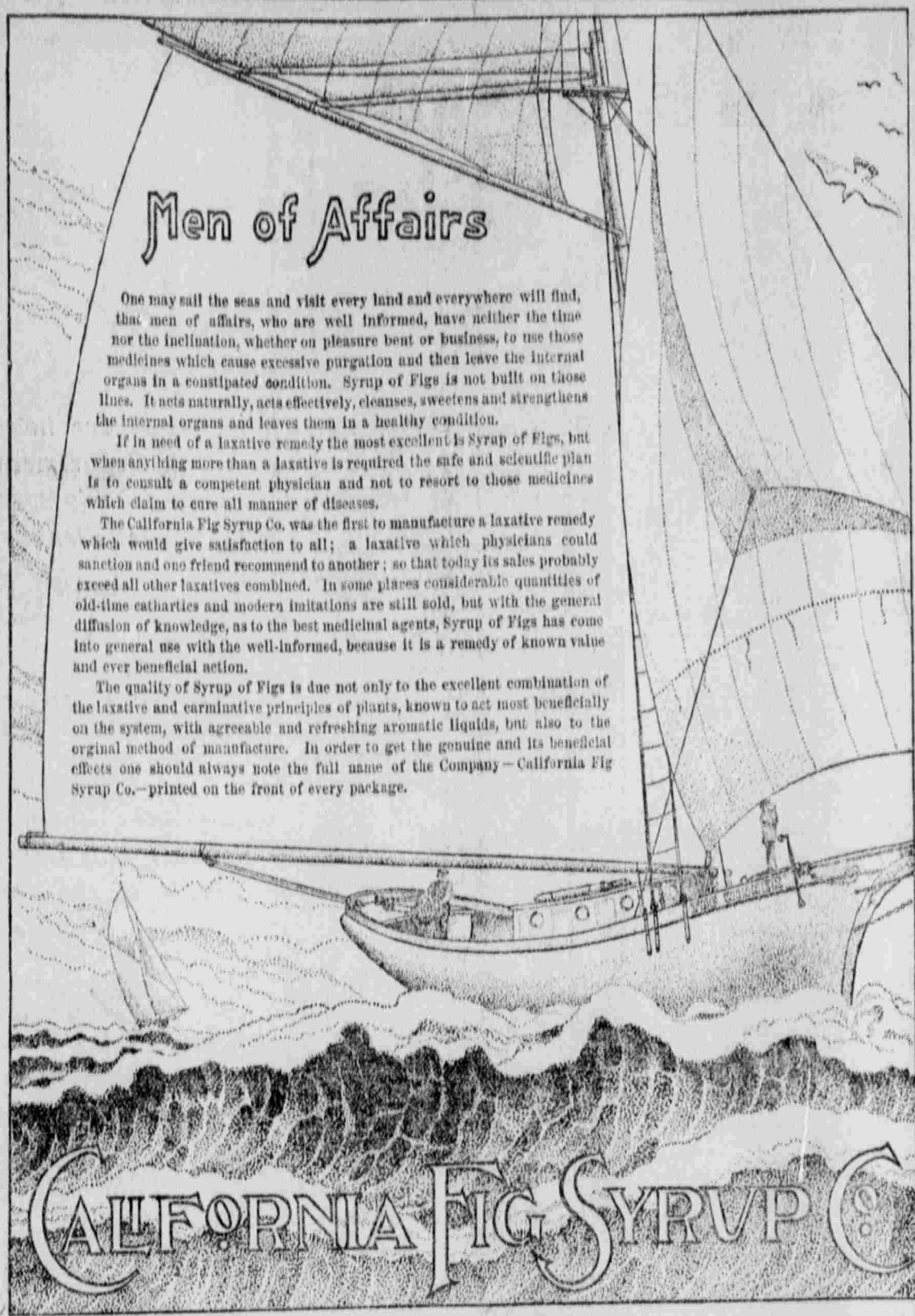

"Prince Henry's last day on the special train which carried him to the south and west, rivaling in interest any of the others spent by the prince on the tour, for it began with a visit to Albany, included a run in bright sunlight down the west shore of the Hudson river, and closed with a reception at the United States military academy at West Point."

## GOV. TAFT IS OPTIMISTIC.

Two Years at Utmost Philippine Commission Will Be Relieved of Its Work.

This Will Be Because Matters Will Have Progressed So Far in Establishing Permanent Government.

Cincinnati, O., March 8.—"In 18 months or two years at the most, matters will have progressed so far in the establishment of a permanent government in the Philippines, that the commission, which has been in the islands for the past two years in the interests of the United States, may be relieved of the work they have been pursuing."

Thus spoke Gov. Wm. H. Taft, head of the Philippine commission, who returned from Washington to Cincinnati to spend several weeks before returning to the east to complete the work that was largely responsible for his return to the United States.

"I hope to have things running sufficiently smoothly by the beginning of 1904 to allow the islands to be governed as any of the territories of the United States. I have every reason to believe that Congress will take speedy action on the governmental and tariff bills that concern the Philippines, and that a form of government for the islands, together with the desired tariff legislation, will be put into force at a very early period."

"During the time I was in the east I received many inquiries in regard to the Philippines from men who had, or claimed to have, large financial interests. There is no doubt that as soon as Congress fixes a form of government and tariff matters are settled there will be a large influx of American capital into the islands which cannot but have a beneficial effect on conditions there. This way the big financiers regard the Philippines is perhaps best illustrated by the statement made to me by J. Pierpont Morgan, who assured me that with a government established in the Philippine Islands bonds could be sold in New York without any guarantee from the United States."

"Referring to the stories that have been circulated from time to time about his taking a place in the cabinet of President Roosevelt Gov. Taft said: 'You cannot make a denial of that report too strong. I have been one desirous to return to the Philippines to assist in the completion of the work that the commission has undertaken. President Roosevelt has expressed the same desire and no circumstances could prevent me from doing so. ## COLOMBIA DOES NOT OBJECT

Welcomes Construction of Panama  
Canal by the United States.

### WILL FACILITATE MATTERS

So That Will Be Asked Will Be That  
Two Countries Agree Upon Their  
Respective Rights.

New York, March 8.—Vicente Concha, minister plenipotentiary to the United States from Colombia, who arrived in this city a few days ago from Bogota, has addressed an official communication to Wm. Nelson Cromwell, general counsel of the new Panama Canal company, on the attitude of Colombia with regard to the construction of the Panama canal. The communication follows:

"Confirming the conference which we have had upon the subject of relations between the republic of Colombia, the United States of America and the new Panama Canal company, I beg leave to state in answer to your specific inquiries that the cable communication made to the Panama Canal company by my government on the 7th ultimo was purely informal and as a reminder of well known conditions and is not declaratory of opposition to the proposed transaction between the canal company and the United States if made under the reserve of an agreement between Colombia and the United States. That incident has been so distorted by the enemies of the Panama canal route that I take pleasure in confirming my assurances to you that the government of Colombia does not at all object to the sale and transfer as proposed by the canal company and will give all requisite consents and do all in its power to facilitate the matter under the reserve referred to. Colombia welcomes the construction of the Panama canal within its domains by the United States and entertains for this government and its people the warmest spirit of cordiality in the completion of this, the greatest enterprise of modern times, destined to have a most beneficial and material influence in the development of the interests of both nations."

"This concurrence of Colombia in any sale by the new Panama Canal company to the government of the United States, with the reservation of course that a mutually satisfactory convention shall be agreed upon between Colombia and the United States as to their respective rights and relations to the Panama canal, to be constructed by the United States, and we have not the least doubt that such agreement will be reached."

"Annuited by this spirit and governed by these views, I have been empowered by my government to proceed with the pending negotiations with this government, and to be constructive by recent instructions and view of my government. I am happy to give assurance of my sincere desire to conclude an agreement as promptly and upon a reasonable basis."

A COLD BLOODED MURDER.  
Husband Substitutes Poison for  
Headache Powder.

Grand Rapids, Mich., March 7.—De-  
velopments in the investigation into  
the death of Mrs. Ada Klump, the  
young wife of William Klump of Low-  
ell, point to one of the most cold-  
blooded murders Michigan has ever  
known. After a diligent inquiry into  
the circumstances of the case, Sheriff  
Chapman took William Klump into cus-  
tody and lodged him in jail here.

The officers express the belief that  
the deadly poisons sent through the  
mail were substituted for the harm-  
less headache powders which the en-  
velopes had originally contained, and  
that they were sent to several physi-  
cians in the village for the purpose of  
throwing the blame upon the manu-  
facturers of the headache remedy and  
thus diverting suspicion from the send-  
er of the poison.

Officers who have investigated the  
case state that Klump was infatuated

with another woman, a widow, whom  
it is alleged he had agreed to marry  
before he was married to Mrs. Klump.  
The pretty 16-year
