

Confesses Complicity.
BOSTON, 16.—Bullard, the Boylston Bank robber, confesses complicity in the crime, but affirms that Glover, who is serving a term of twelve years in the State prison, was entirely innocent, even in the knowledge of the deed; Bullard will be arraigned before the superior court, and will doubtless plead guilty.

Wool Market.
There has not been much life in the wool market during the past few days, although the trade continues quite healthy and prices are well sustained. The demand is fair for all grades, and holders are indifferent about selling unless full current rates are offered. The sales have been at 52 1/2 @ 53 per lb. for medium N and XX, Ohio fleeces are up to slaty for XXX and above. Michigan fleeces 50 and 52. Wisconsin and other western fleeces 48 @ 52. The demand for delaine and combing fleeces is good, and all available lots are quickly taken at 57 @ 62. California spring has been in fair demand at 42 @ 43. The stock of pulled is light, but lambs begin to arrive more freely. Sales at 42 @ 50 for lambs and 50 @ 55 for good and choice super.

Peace Prevails.
NEW ORLEANS, 16.—The president of the Chamber of Commerce, Clearing House and Cotton Exchange and Merchants' Exchange telegraphed Grant to-day, a statement that the city is perfectly quiet and peaceful, business resuming and further trouble is not anticipated; James F. Casey, of the Custom House, indorses this statement. The executive committee of the Merchants' Exchange telegraphed a similar message to the Board of Trade of Chicago, St. Louis and Cincinnati.

Carpet-baggers Awaiting Federal Bayonets.
Governor Kellogg and his followers remain in the Custom House. The Governor appears to be in good spirits, and is quietly awaiting the expiration of the five days, allowed by the President, while he expects to be restored by the military. He insists that he must be put back by U. S. troops, and maintained by them.

Baton Rouge and East Baton Rouge turned out the Kellogg officials to-day, and installed the McEnery officials, who are in the parish. Livingstone Parish declared for McEnery this morning; the adjacent parishes will do the same to-morrow. There is no disturbance.

Petition to Grant.
The following dispatch was sent to President Grant to-day:
"A petition has been forwarded you to-day by express, signed by 500 of the leading merchants and business men of this city, as follows: 'We, the undersigned merchants, representing the commercial interests of New Orleans, and deeply interested in the welfare and prosperity of the State, gladly embrace the recent change of government, and guarantee impartial rights to all. We respectfully request your sympathy and support of the executive.'"

FRANCE.
Challenges the Government.
PARIS, 16.—Berger, the Bonapartist candidate in the department of Maine-et-Loire, has withdrawn from the second contest, and in a letter, attributes his failure to the assertion of the minister of the interior that he deserved prosecution for his electoral address; he says that he intends to republish the address and he challenges the government to prosecute him.

Well Received—About to Abdicate.
President MacMahon has been well received in his last tour, especially at Arras and Amiens. The *Moniteur* revives the rumor that King Louis of Bavaria is about to abdicate.

GREAT BRITAIN.

Old Catholic Conference.
LONDON, 16.—A dispatch from Bonn says the Old Catholic Conference has come to an agreement on all the important points of their dogma. The Bishop of Pittsburgh, on behalf of American Protestants, thanked Dr. Dollinger for the manner in which he had conducted the deliberations and presented written statements of congratulation to the conference on the harmony and agreement manifested. The accomplished Dean of Chester and others spoke in similar terms.

Laborers for Canada—To be Arbitrated.
LIVERPOOL, 16.—The steamship *Lyons*, which sails to-morrow for Quebec, takes 300 agricultural laborers, who go to Canada for work and homes.

The differences which caused the great strike of mill operatives at Bolton, have been referred to arbitration.

BERNE, 16.—The International Postal Congress has resolved to recommend uniformity of postage in all the territory embraced by the postal union.

PRUSSIA.

Trial of Kullman—The Pope Will Not Recognize Spain.
BERLIN, 16.—The preliminary of the trial of Kullman, who attempted to shoot King William, has been completed; the prisoner is to be tried in Warsaw about the middle of October.

The German newspaper states that the Pope has peremptorily refused to join the European powers in the recognition of Spain.
