Annual Report of Superintendent J. A. Haines.

CONDITION OF THE INSTITUTION.

Number of Pupils Committed Since the Opening—Annual Appropriation for Its Maintenance.

The annual report of the superintendent of the Reform school at Ogden to the board of trustees for the year ending Dec. 31, 1894, is now before us. It consists of a pamphlet of twenty-five pages, and is printed by the state printer at Ogden.

The report shows that the total number committed Dec. 31st was thirty-two, of which twenty-four were males and eight were females. The number on hands at the close of the year was six females. During the year there were committed thirteen males and eight females, while the total number committed since the opening of the school, Oct. 1st, 1893, is one hundred and twenty-five males and twenty-five females.

The revenue of the Territory as represented in the annual budget bill for the year ending Dec. 31st, 1894, is \$1,000,000. The total amount appropriated by the legislature for the year ending Dec. 31st, 1894, is \$1,000,000, which is the same as the appropriation for the year 1893, \$1,000,000.
