

## TWO DAYS' CONFERENCE.

Held at Morgan City, Morgan County, June 30th, and July 1st, 1877.

According to appointment, Apostles Lorenzo Snow and Franklin D. Richards came to Morgan City and held two days' Conference for the purpose of organizing Morgan County into a Stake of Zion.

The Conference was held in a large bowery, one hundred feet square, erected the day previous by willing hands for the occasion.

Present on the stand—Of the Twelve, Elders Lorenzo Snow and F. D. Richards; Bishops W. W. Cluff, W. G. Smith and C. S. Peterson; Elders Wm. Eddington, R. Fry, E. T. Clark and a number of other Elders.

Elders Snow and Richards and Bishop Cluff occupied the forenoon and afternoon of Saturday, June 30, giving excellent and appropriate instructions to the vast congregation assembled from all parts of the county.

Sunday, July 1st, was taken up with instructions from the Apostles and the election of the necessary officers to perfect the stake organization, who were ordained and set apart by the apostles. The following is the list of the officers of the Stake—
