PROGRAMME.
FOR THE SUNDAY SCHOOL JUBILEE.
REHEARSAL TO BE HELD IN
TABERNALE SUNDAY,
OCTOBER 24TH.

To prevent confusion, and in order that each Sunday school may know in what order to move, the following programme is published:

- 1.—Each Sunday school is expected to be in place at 10 o'clock, as it is designed to commence the exercises punctually at that hour.
- 2.—Each superintendent will be particular to select two efficient male scholars from his school, to meet Prof. C. A. Thomas at the Tabernacle at 9:30 o'clock. These scholars will be posted at the door through which their respective schools are to enter, and will show them the seats they are to occupy.
- 3.—The various schools will enter the building in the following order: From the First to the Tenth Wards (inclusive) through the south doors—from the Eleventh to the Twenty-first (inclusive) through the north doors. The Fourteenth Ward school is requested to be on hand in good time at 9:30 o'clock. These scholars will be posted at the door through which their respective schools are to enter, and will show them the seats they are to occupy.
- 4.—The orchestra will occupy the platform in front of the bishops' seats.
- 5.—The Sixth Ward Band will occupy the stage seats.
- 6.—The Eleventh and Twelfth Ward choirs, and the thirty children from the seventh and eighth wards will occupy the Tabernacle choir seats.
- 7.—The Fourteenth Ward Sunday School will be seated on the front double benches immediately in front of the platform.

THE SUNDAY SCHOOL JUBILEE.
INSTRUCTIONS TO PARENTS AND SUPERINTENDENTS.
It is very desirable for the parents of the Sunday School children to have them early enough at their various schools on Sunday morning, so as to reach the Tabernacle or Assembly Hall in time to be seated in their places by 10 o'clock a.m. The hour the general rehearsal will commence. And unless the children have been committed to memory the songs they will sing, they should be furnished with sufficient music books, so that the full benefit of all the children's voices may be obtained.

AN INTERESTING RELIC.—Professor Barfoot, of the Museum, has shown us a copy of an invitation extended by the Late President Brigham Young, to a large number of friends, to attend a picnic party at the headwaters of Big Cottonwood, on the 24th of July, 1857. The invitation was printed on a small sheet of blue tinted paper, and filled out as follows:

"President Brigham Young respectfully invites Andrew W. Winberg and family to attend a picnic party at the Lake in Big Cottonwood Canyon, on Friday, 24th of July. Regulations: You will be required to start so as to pass the first mill, about four miles up the Canyon, before 12 o'clock, on Thursday the 23d, as no person will be allowed to pass that point after 2 o'clock p.m. of that day.

All persons are forbidden to smoke cigars or pipes, or kindle fires at any place in the canyon, except on the camp ground.

The Bishops are requested to accompany those invited to their respective wards, and see that each person is well fitted for the trip, with good, substantial, steady teams, wagon, harness, and back, and looks capable of completing the journey without repairs, and a good driver, so as not to endanger the life of any individual.

Bishops will, before passing the first mill, furnish a full and complete list of all persons accompanying them from their respective wards, and hand the same to the guard at the gate.

Additional interest attaches to this relic from the fact that the day thus celebrated was the one on which the news of the approach of Johnston's army with the avowed purpose of exterminating the "Mormons," was brought to President Young, while he and his friends were in the midst of their picnic in the canyon. Many of our readers were there at the time, and thousands of others are almost as familiar with the circumstance as those who participated.

BRIEF TELEGRAMS.
The Capetown government intends to send large reinforcements to Basutoland.

The managers of the cutting rail road have met to-day and agreed on the settlement of passenger rates.

It has now transpired that the new Turkish proposals seek to postpone the surrender of Dulcigno much longer than was expected.

Gen. Decaisne is now in Paris and Gambetta favors a searching inquiry into his case. The scandal is assuming immense proportions.

A gunboat is anchored in the rear of Havana, near Castletown, where a meeting will be held on Sunday. The police have also been there.

There is news from Turkistan that troops there are to be reinforced by a regiment of Cossacks and a battery of artillery. The Sappos and infantry will also be reinforced.

The well fortified towns on the Turcoman Steppe are provisioned for six months. The Bani is fortified and provisioned very completely. All arrangements are nearly completed for an advance of 1,000 men and 1,000 guns will advance.

The Montenegrin commissioner has received a telegram from the Turkish commissioner, asking him to transfer the negotiations from Rjeka to Viorbazar, where he would arrive on the 23d inst. The request has been complied with.

In consequence of the disturbed state of West Ireland, a detachment of troops will be sent to Hantry. These precautions are believed to indicate the intention of government to place the district under proclamation.

There is a rumor that in consequence of court intrigues against General Melikoff he will retire to the Caucasus and the committee of ministers which is antagonistic to Melikoff in politics will be recognized. The *Russia* has been suspended for publishing the above.

Editor Deseret News:
We have had a week of very severe weather, beginning with a snow storm and continuing to snow and blow nearly all the time. The passenger trains on the Denver, Salt Lake and Pacific Railway, on the 15th inst., were delayed about twenty-eight hours at Como, by the ditching of two of the largest engines on the road, one of them being a total wreck and still lying on her side in the ditch. Cause—snow drifts several feet deep, packed so hard as to carry the engine over the rails. The climate of this place is far different to the beautiful valleys in my much beloved home in Utah.

The health of the people here is generally good. There are quite a few of our people here and we are living in hopes of having, at no distant day, a school-house and district to send our children to obtain one of the greatest boons that parents can give to their children, namely, an education.
