

## NEWS OF THE WEST.

Death Brought by a Chinese Doctor's Treatment.

FELL 100 FEET AND ESCAPED.

Water H. Stever, driver of a mail stage between Vancouver and Newhaven, B.C., was killed Tuesday afternoon by a falling tree. The remains of the stage, which was also injured, were recovered.

A man without a hair on every hairless was caught in a trap at James Cowan's camp on North Cross River, Oregon, the other day. Among the many theories advanced to explain this singular condition, it was stated by a stroke of lightning.

Frances Jenkins, 6 years of age, arrived in San Francisco Wednesday from Philadelphia, whence she traveled alone. The trip occupied five days. On Friday reaching the Ferry Terminal, she fell into a crowd, and was met by Mrs. J. W. Orr, and taken by them to their home.

J. J. Marshall and Frank G. Griffin, electricians, fell down an elevator shaft in a new building on Market street, San Francisco, about 100 feet at noon Wednesday, and unfortunately escaped with only slight injuries or receiving only serious injury. One had a few sprains & a gash on his head.

The Pacific Steam Whaling company will build two more canneries to Alaska this year. One will be at Hunter Bay, Prince Edward sound, and the other at the mouth of the Nass river. The new whaling masters and cannery machinery will be forwarded as soon as the spring opens in Alaska.

T. Ward, a friend of Barney's, furnished the money, and the sick man was removed to the Chinese hospital. The doctor advised the sick man to ride in his carriage and ride, and totals he said that the Chinese doctor never used him with some kind of positions composed of cow manure. The patient was in high fever, but all his appeals given were refused, he being merely given some tea and rice. Tuesday night Dr. Clark, who had come to see the man, but he was beyond him, said, and died Tuesday night. While his death is attributed to heart trouble, there is said to be no doubt that it was hastened by malpractice.
