EVENING NEWS.

Wednesday, March 29, 1883.

CITY COUNCIL.

Proceedings at the City Council Tuesday evening, March 27th, 1883. Mayor Jennings presiding.

A petition was presented from J. P. Simmons and four others asking an extension of water mains from the north side of South Temple street, along Oak Street, a distance of one-half mile, to be laid on the north side of Fruit Street at the earliest possible date; and representing that they were prepared to advance towards said improvement the three-fourths of the cost thereof.

Watson Brothers asked the privilege of using a portion of the street and sidewalk in front of premises a few doors east of the Salt Lake Theatre, for a period of three months, or during the process of erection of a building for Mrs. Madison. Granted under the usual restrictions.

A petition was presented from William C. Neal and forty-three others, residents of the Nineteenth Ward, owning and using water flowing through the water ditch, north of H. Klammer's residence, on Centre street, asking that the Council instruct the city watermaster to cause their proportion of water to be kept on the east side of said street near Mr. Hopwood's residence instead of being sent down street and back again, as they were satisfied that by so doing the water belonging to petitioners would be liable to shrinkage. Laid on the table pending a report on the subject on petition of H. Grow and others, from the committee on streets and alleys.

A petition was presented from Fred. Bollwinkel, Thomas Platts, and Orson Platts representing that they were residents and property owners near the residence of Henry Grover on Centre street, and used water from what is called the old bath house ditch, on the lower side of said street; that they had been ordered by the city watermaster to enter into the former order of the City Council in relation to ditches, but wished that their order to the watermaster be carried out; that they were informed of a large proportion, if not all, of the signs of the petition to the Council headed by Mr. Grover, were issued by Henry Grover, who was going to take all of the water out of the lower ditch, which would subject them to great inconvenience in the event of a fire. The petitioners learned was not the case. This petition was also laid on the table pending a report of the committee on streets and alleys, on petition of H. Grow and others, from the committee on streets and alleys.

A petition was presented from George Goddard, setting forth that he was the owner of a piece of land within the city limits, formerly owned by Edmund Ellsworth, and situated in the southeast corner of the city, and which had been occupied and used continuously for many years, and that he had been over thirty years; that at the time of the property coming into his possession some five years ago, it was with the understanding that on his part, that the land was justly entitled to its proper share of the water flowing into the city; that for a year or two past he had been supplied with water in the supply water for agricultural purposes, so much so that he had suffered considerable loss in consequence of the fact that the water among the first that was entitled to the water. The petitioner therefore asked that the matter be properly investigated and that the amount of water rightfully belonging to said property be apportioned thereto. Referred to committee on irrigation.

A petition for a license to do business as a retail liquor dealer at No. 151 Commercial Street, for a period of three months from the 1st day of March, 1883, was presented from B. F. Young, Jr. Granted.

A communication was presented from Charles Smith, the last report of receipts and disbursements of Salt Lake City corporation for the quarter ending February 28th, 1883, showing a balance in treasury at last report of \$40,817.89; total receipts for the quarter, \$45,050.91; disbursements during the quarter, \$43,498.10; balance in treasury Feb. 28, 1883, \$12,369.70. Referred to the committee on finance.

The committee on Streets and alleys, to whom was referred the petition of H. O. Barrell, and thirteen others, in relation to the canal on Pine Street, recommended that the supervisor of streets be instructed to make the desired improvements as soon as practicable. Adopted.

The following report was submitted: Your committee on streets and alleys to whom was referred the petition of Henry Grover and others, on Centre street, big have to report the following: A careful examination of the locality and the necessities of the residents on said street, we are of the opinion that the lines on said street should be determined, the main line should cross the street where it is now located and continue along the west side of the street to the point where it now crosses the street and watermaster be instructed accordingly. After a prolonged discussion between Alderman Raleigh, chairman of the committee on streets and alleys who refused to sign the above report, and the other members of committee who did sign it, the report was adopted and the recommendations accepted.

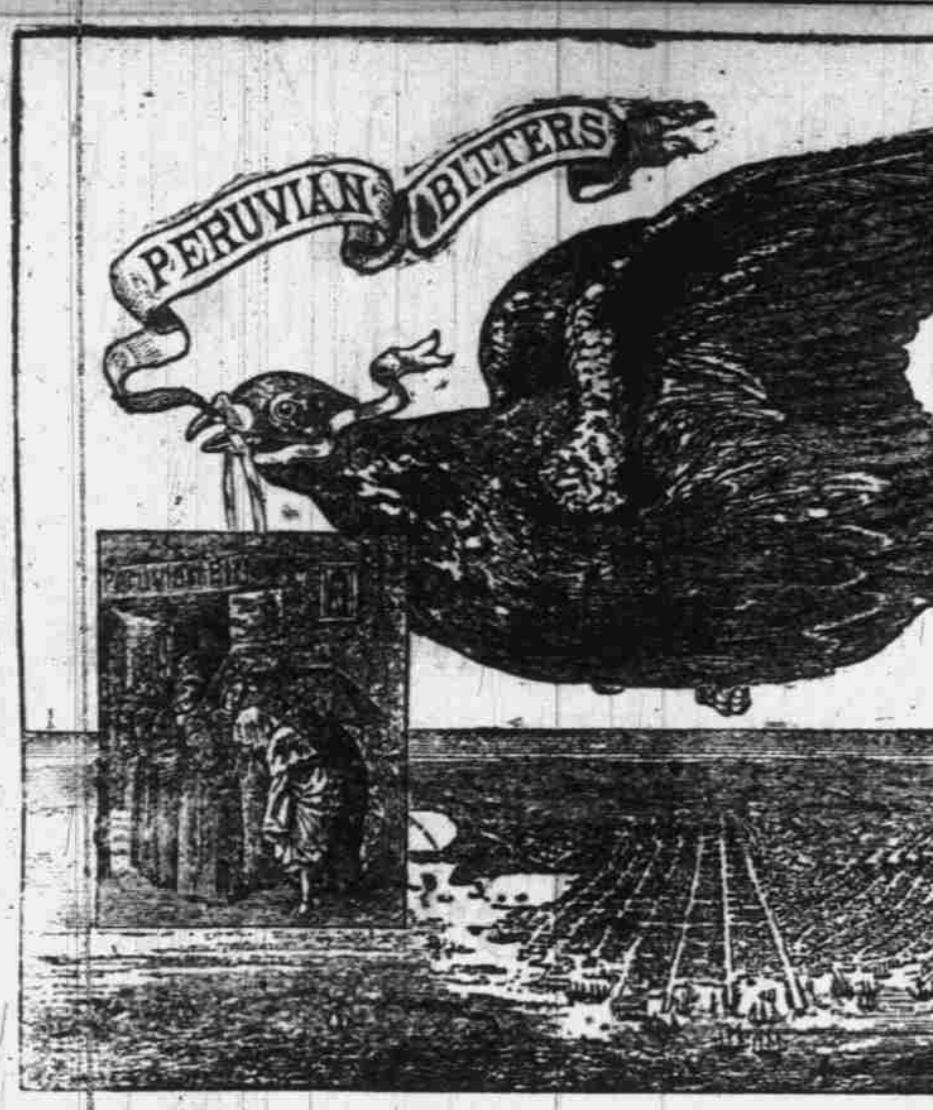
