denial of the "insurgent" character of these preliminary mass meetings has been made, still opposition papers have so thoroughly dubbed the committee an "insurgent" one that its line of battle has been marked out for it to be a test of strength as to whether the coming Republican convention will send the congressional delegation or will choose six men direct from the ranks without previous condition of political service, to be present at Chicago's national convention.

CRITCHLOW'S DENIAL. That this is a fair test of the committee's purposes Mr. Critchlow denies, and says that these meetings are no more than conferences to precede the convention, so that stock may be taken of the political situation.

It is pointed out that the "American" party will make every effort to land Kearns votes from Salt Lake county, and that in the past the control of a very few votes has been all that was necessary to swing a final senatorial result. With the prospect of a scattering Democratic representation that will total into more formidable numbers than were encountered last year the Republicans are taking stock early in their political house, that they may set it in order before the day of final battle. This is the reason for the Second South street gatherings today.

radiate in every direction, and this not only in the Republican party. The choosing of Frank Nebeker as Democratic national committeeman this week is declared by Democrats to be significant of a new condition within the party. These conventions will choose delegates to the Denver convention and to the Chicago convention, and will put forth the plea that they are the only truly-truly politicians in the state, protesting through their delegations the party delegations chosen in the Republican and Democratic June conventions.
