Fourth--That if without previous consent voluntarily he shall have quit-ted the service of the corporation or of its subsidiary companies, he shall forfeit all right to this stock, and in such case it will be held in a fund, which, at the end of five years, will be divided among such employee as shall have complied with all the con-ditions. litions.
