

CULLED FROM LATEST EXCHANGES. The Cassia County Times of the 30th ult. says: A prisoner, on the charge o herse stealing, is now confined in the county jail at a cost to the public of \$3.75 per day. Next spring when the county treasury is exhausted, people will look around and wonder what has become of the money. Including the cost of keeping and the trial, this one case will amount to about fifteen hundred dollars, about haif as much as the salaries of all the officers in the county. This is the boasted economy of the new law.

Bennett Bros. & Larabie, who have the street railway franchise in Butte, Montana, despite the best business methods and well-applied energies have met with the most annoying delays to getting the material for their projected street rallway in Butte It also appears that the Van Depoel electric system will not give a suffi cient rate of speed on the heavy grade: of Butte without the application of an enormous power, and it is possible the electric project may be given up The projectors appear now to favor the steam street car system—that is with noiseless exhaust locomotives, as used in many cities in the country-and an application is before the city coun-

The keys were cleverly made and would most likely have opened the

oor. One of the keys is an old one used by some former jailer. How i got into the jail is not known. No doubt is entertained that the whole affair was a deep-laid plot, and that some outsiders helped it along. Fred-rich was manacled, and informations will probably be made against him and others for attempting a jail delivery.


