worthy a short description, as one of the sights of New York, inter-esting to all who would study our art development. In the room where the artists were at work we saw the process of making the pic-tures. Some of the sketches which appear in the *Graphic* are first drawn by hand on paper with a pen and ink. They are finished up just as they are to appear in the paper. This sketch is then copied upon a glass plate through the in-strumentality of a camera. The plate is called a negative, and from it, by the aid of the sun, or a power-ful artificial light, a copy of the picture is obtained on transfer paper. This transfer paper is very thin, and so made that it will readily yield to a lithographic stone. After having been properly prepared the transfer paper is placed upon the stone, face down, from which the *Graphic* is to be printed, and a transfer is made. The result is, the picture which was originally drawn with a pen, appears upon the smooth surface of the lithographic stone, and is an exact fac simile of the original.
