BY TELEGRAPH.

WESTERN.

No Delay in the Execution of Vasquez—Confesses that he is a Murderer.

SAN FRANCISCO, 17.—Governor Pacifico has replied to the telegraphic petition of the citizens of Los Angeles, declining to postpone the execution of Vasquez, and saying that danger from the operations of his lieutenant Chavez will be great at the end of the delay as now.

A letter from Florence, Arizona, to the San Diego Union, gives a detailed interview with Bender, the Kansas murderer. He confesses that he is John Bender, and states that he did not commit the murder, but that John and Kate, his son and daughter, did. He declines to state the whereabouts of his family, but says they went from Kansas to Texas, and there separated, he coming to New Mexico, and subsequently to Arizona. He left John and Kate with the old woman. A requisition from the governor of Kansas is daily expected, when he will be taken there.

FOREIGN.

GREAT BRITAIN.

A Heavy Failure.

LONDON, 17.—Shedden & Co., general merchants, 59, Mark Lane, have suspended; liabilities two million dollars. The suspension was caused by the failure of Imthurn & Co. Other suspensions are reported as imminent.

FRANCE.

Jury of Physicians Appointed.

PARIS, 17.—The Assembly, today, adopted a resolution providing for the appointment of a jury of physicians, to inquire into the cases of Bonaparte enjoying pensions on account of infirmities alleged to have been contracted in the service of the state.

The Left, upon condition that a day be appointed for the dissolution of the Assembly, which shall be six months after the Easter recess, are inclined to agree to a proposal of the government, that no more elections shall be ordered to fill vacancies in the present Assembly. The question of filling vacancies, which is thus made to involve the question of dissolution, will be brought up for debate soon.

SPAIN.

Carlist Loss.

MADRID, 17.—The Carlists lost 500 men in the attack on Zugadury.

IRELAND.

St. Patrick's Day.

DUBLIN, 17.—St. Patrick's Day was celebrated with the usual ceremonies and festivities throughout Ireland; there was no disturbance.

GERMANY.

Enroute to Styria.

MUNICH, 17.—Don Alfonso and the Princess Blanca have arrived in this city, enroute to Styria.

PRUSSIA.

Extradition Demanded.

BERLIN, 17.—The Post says that Spain has demanded the extradition from German territory of Don Alfonso, brother of Don Carlos, charging him with offenses against the common law. Spain has extradition treaties with the individual German states, but not with the Empire. The documents required in such cases, under their treaties with Bavaria and Hesse, have been lodged by Spain.

A Catholic Petition.

The Archbishop of Cologne, on behalf of the whole Roman Catholic Episcopate of Prussia, has sent a petition to the lower house of the Prussian Diet, urging it not to pass that part of the Ecclesiastical bill which gives the people a share in the administration of local church property.
