HUSBAND COMMITTED SUICIDE

Thought He Had Killed His Wife But She Only Fainted.

Washington, Nov. 16 .- Senator Dryien of New Jersey, who is president of one of the largest life insurance companies in the country, had a talk with the president today on the subject of in-surance, which the president will dis-cuss freely in his forthcoming mes-sage to Congress.

suge to Congress. Senator Dryden will introduce at the approaching session a bill providing for federal supervision of life insur-ance. It will differ in some respects from the measure Mr. Dryden infrofrom the measure AR. Dryden miro-duced in the last Congress, but the principle will be the same. He indicat-ed, in response to inquiries, that the supreme court never had passed upon the constitutionality of a federal law regulating insurance, although it had had under consideration cases involving much for her bart bare there here purely state laws that interstate insur-ance was not interstate commerce.

"It is a fact," said Senator Dryden, "that eminent lawyers of the country differ as to the constitutionality of a law providing for federal supervision of life insurance. That difference, probably will have to be removed by the supreme court.

A FALSE EMPEROR HAS APPEARED IN RUSSIA.

St. Petersburg, Nov. 16, 5:45 p. m.—A false emperor has suddenly made his appearance near Penza and already his followers number 59,000. This is the startling report received this afternoon

startling report received this afternoon in a dispatch from Simbirsk. Penza is in the heart of the vast region extending westward from the Volga where agrarian uprisings on a large scale have been occurring and if the report turns out to be true that, the pretender to the throne has placed himself at the head of the peasantry the government will soon face, besides its other troubles, a formidable agrar-ian rebellion. It required a year to suppress the famous rebellion led by Pugaticheff, who impersonated the Pugaticheff, who impersonated the dethroused and murdered Peter III, in the time of Catherine II. That upris-ing was started in the same region on the banks of the Volga.
