North American Copper Company Declines to Sell F. H. Mine.

Battle Lake, Wyo., Feb. 5.—News has been received here that the North American Copper company was recent-iy offered \$3,000,000 for the Ferris-Hag-garty copper mine, but declined to sell. The offer was made by a New York gyndicate. The property was examined by an expert sent out by the syndicate and he reported that the Ferris-Hag-garty would prove one of the richest copper propositions in the world,

Bingham Con's Indebtedness.

A Boston publication in speaking of the \$1,000,000 bond issue recently authorized by the Bingham Con. directors, says: 'The company's indebtedness represents mainly properties purchased for which notes were given and which notes are not yet due. Some of the note holders will take the new bonds when the notes mature. Not more than \$500,-000 bonds will issue at the start, the re-mainder to issue when outstanding oblizations not yet due mature. The bonds will be underwritten and offered to shareholders. The company is in no im-mediate need of funds, but it has been deemed expedient by the directors to fund cap tal expenditures at this time and allow the stockholders to have the benefit of net earnings, rather than to make these expenditures out of earnings and thus indefinitely postpone any return to stockholders.
