

RAILROADS IN MORE DISGRACE

The right of a railroad company to divert shipments of coal from private consignees to its own use is to be sifted to the bottom, and with this object in view a committee of representative citizens and shippers from the various cities in Utah county arrived in Salt Lake this afternoon with the intention of calling upon Gov. Cutler and placing the matter before him with the object in view of seeking a solution. It has been an open secret since the shortage of coal in Utah commenced that scores of carloads of coal have been diverted, coal shipped to dealers, corporations and individuals has never reached its destination. Whenever the railroad supply for its motive power ran short, the load was simply sidetracked and dumped at a coaling station. Dealers in Salt Lake have simply grined and borne it, not caring to play a ruse in the face of the recent object lesson delivered in the Sharp case. However, the delegation, have no such scruples. The delegation, which included S. I. Goodwin, superintendent of the People's Co-op, and one of the board of the Lehi Commercial club, arrived here about 2 p. m., with the object in view of calling upon the governor later on in the afternoon after some business had been transacted.

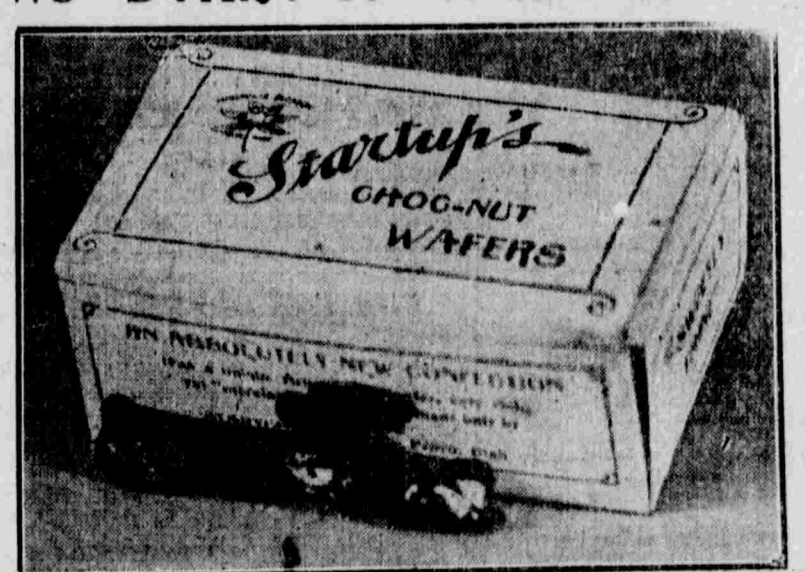
ANOTHER BIG SUIT.

Woman Wants \$10,000 Because Boulder Crashed Through House.

Alleging that as the result of a blast fired by defendants at Bingham on Oct. 6, 1906, a large boulder rolled down the mountain side and crashed through her house and gave her such a nervous shock that her health has been permanently impaired, Violet V. Darrouge filed suit in the district court today against Deal Bros. & Mendenhall Construction company, Utah Construction company, Rio Grande Railway company and W. F. Crandall to recover damages in the sum of \$10,000. Plaintiff alleged that the defendants were excavating for a railroad above her home in Bingham and that while she was peacefully sitting in the house on the date mentioned above, they fired off a blast and caused an immense boulder to roll down the mountain with such force as to crash through her house. She claims that the defendants gave no warning of the blast and took no precautions to prevent boulders from rolling down the hill and injuring people and that she received such a severe shock that her health is permanently injured.
