

**CALLS IT PANIC
OF PROSPERITY**

Congressman Dalzell Says Effects of Stringency Were World Wide.

HAD TOO MUCH BUSINESS.

Europe, and Especially England, Hard Hit—Senator Owen's Favorable Reception—Financial Views.

Washington, D. C., March 14.—As if speaking by the card, Congressman John Dalzell predicts that there will be no tariff commission. He holds that the people's representatives in the house will not surrender their prerogatives and permit a commission of outsiders to do what Congress is expected to do. Mr. Dalzell contends that the late depression in business is not a "United States panic." He insists that it prevails throughout the world. It is a panic, he says, that is worldwide in its effects. He actually calls it a "prosperity panic," because manufacturers and others had more business than they had money to carry on operations with, and a sudden halt had to be made. It has hit, according to his information, Great Britain much harder than it has hit this country, reliable figures showing that over \$6,000,000 people are now in the workhouses of London alone, and deplorable conditions are reported.

VIEWS OF CHAS. A. MOORE.
A statement has been generally circulated here which is unique for the reason that in it Charles A. Moore of New York, president of the American Protective Tariff league, undertakes to account for the panic which causes so much distress here and the political leaders in Congress. Mr. Moore says: "This so-called 'panic' has been of an entirely different character from any I have ever experienced in my 35 years of active business connection. Business seemed, as it were, to drop right off abruptly, without any gradual decline downward, but with a sudden stopping in the receipt of orders and a general halt to the work. It may be more properly termed a financial depression than an industrial one. It is almost phenomenal to see the condition in which the entire industrial interests of the country were busy, with plenty of orders on their books and with no apparent diminution in trade and with no large stocks of goods carried in any line in any part of the country, and then to see the business brought to such a sudden stoppage. It naturally causes one to note the condition as peculiar and distinct from any previous business depression we have had in my active experience." Mr. Moore is of the opinion that the depression is of only a temporary character and that this temporary recession in business will have its good effect.

NEW SENATOR MAKES RECORD.
The maiden speech of Senator Owen of Oklahoma was a "coraker" for length. When revised and cut down to the matter he obtained leave to print it made 53 pages in the Congressional Record. As is well known, he spoke on the Aldrich financial bill. He is going to do his utmost to have it amended in essential particulars, but has announced that rather than have no legislation at all this session he will vote for it on the ground that some sort of relief is emanated by the business interests of the United States. Senator Owen has had valuable experience in the management of banks and has made a close study of financial conditions. His ability to handle the subject and readily answer any and all questions propounded to him demonstrated that for a first term senator he was surprisingly forceful in his argument. That speech has undoubtedly given him an enviable reputation. Veteran legislators admit that he made points which they hardly expected from one so recently sent to Washington.

Senator Owen received one of the largest fees ever paid to an American lawyer. It was in the famous Cherokee case before the supreme court. Justice Harlan has often said that he used his 30 or more years on that bench he has never heard a stronger argument. The government attorneys did not have a peg to stand on when Owen finished.

ECONOMY IN LOGGING METHODS.

The bureau of forestry has been gathering interesting points as to the waste of trees that is now being averted by lumbermen. Changed conditions have completely revolutionized the logging methods of several of the largest lumber companies in the south. Instead of felling the tree and saving it into logs in the woods they simply trim off the branches and haul off the whole tree. It is then thrown into a log pond, picked up on endless chains and sawed into desired lengths. One concern in the south with which the forest service has been co-operation has been running a separate mill for this purpose. The savings in each case will be considerable and cost of manufacture are considerable and more than pay for the initial costs of the mill and those of maintenance.

**RIO CONFERENCE BEGINS
WORK IN WASHINGTON.**

Washington, March 17.—To execute the suggestions of the Rio conference, contained in 14 resolutions, all calculated to strengthen the bond between the governments of the American continent, there met today in the diplomatic room of the state department the 12 men whom Secy. Root recently selected as the Pan-American committee of the United States. The committee perfected its organization and Secy. Root outlined its work in a brief address. The Rio conference had agreed that each country should appoint its own committee, which in each case will endeavor to make suggestions to its government and in so far as possible obtain its government's official action and the suggestions of the conference.

THREE RATIFIED.

The product of the Rio conference was four treaties and 14 resolutions. Of the treaties the United States senate has ratified three, and will doubtless take no action on the fourth. The three ratified relate to naturalization, pecuniary claims and international law. Of the resolutions with which the committee was to do, two are referred to the Hague conference—navigation and public debts. The remaining resolutions relate to reorganization and construction of a building for the bureau of American republics, encouragement of transportation facilities between American ports, Pan-American conference plans, sanitation, inter-continental railway projects, etc.

**RETIREMENT OF EVANS
WILL ADVANCE OTHERS**

Washington, March 17.—Rear Admiral Charles S. Evans will be relieved in chief of the Atlantic battleship fleet when it leaves San Francisco in July to encircle the globe. This important detail was decided on by President Roosevelt and his cabinet today.

To Rear Admiral Thomas comes the honor of commanding the fleet on its visit to Puget sound and until the home-ward journey begins. He has been second in command during the voyage, and will retire in October.

These retirements make possible two promotions to the grade of rear admiral, and these are to be filled by the advancement of Capt. Saxon S. Snyder and Capt. Richard Walnwright, who will command, respectively, the third and fourth squadrons of the fleet, and Rear Admiral Emory, the second.

**RIOTOUS RAH RAHS
LANGUISH IN JAIL.**

Ann Arbor, Mich., March 17.—All the members of Michigan's student army of last night in a riot at the Star theater are tonight at liberty, but 15 of them had to furnish \$1,000 bail each, and were sent back to their cells like criminals, handcuffed and under a

heavy police guard. Three students pleaded guilty to a charge of looting and were fined \$100 each. The 15 who gave bail will have their examinations Friday morning on a charge of rioting. When the boys were arraigned and their bail was fixed local business men came to their aid with offers of bail, the required amount being promptly furnished in each case.

At a mass meeting of students tonight, presided over by the football tackle, Walter Rehnisch, it was decided to raise money by popular subscription to reimburse the owners whose property was damaged in last night's riot, on condition that the criminal charges against the students be dismissed. It is estimated that the damage amounts to \$2,500.

RICH INDIAN FAMILY.

The Berryhill family is one of the largest in the Creek nation. There are more than seven members of its various branches. This family draws more money for oil royalties than any other in Oklahoma.

The family now draws from \$15,000 to \$20,000 each month. Some individual members of the family have the richest producing allotments in the oil field. One draws \$3,000 a month royalty and another draws 2,000. There are many members of the family whose allotments have not yet been drilled, and there are others whose allotments are outside of the present development, but they are likely to be brought in almost any time.

Tobe Berryhill is an Indian preacher, and was one of the men most active in the movement to have the Indians sell their allotments and go to Old Mexico, take up a land grant there and live according to their old customs. There has not been much heard about going to Mexico since the Berryhills commenced to draw his royalties from their allotments. (Missouri Correspondence St. Louis Republic.)

**ALIA TOLD WOMAN
HE WOULD MURDER**

On Eve of His Departure from Paterson, Priest's Assassination Was Forecasted.

DENVER POLICE HAVE CLUES.

Return of Father Eusebius Puts Them In Possession of Facts Which May Reveal Details of Plot.

Denver, March 18.—The News today says: To an Italian woman of Paterson, N. J., Giuseppe Alia, the assassin who murdered Father Leo Heinrichs at the altar of St. Elizabeth's Catholic church, whispered a prophecy on the eve of his departure for the west.

"Within six months you will hear of a murder that will shock the world," said he. When over the wire came the news of the assassination in Denver, the woman, stricken with terror, repeated the words of Alia.

Father Eusebius, while in Paterson, whether he journeyed with the body of the martyred priest, was informed of the interview which Alia had with the woman, and caused inquiries to be made. He returned to Denver last night with news that may put the police on the track of a bloodthirsty band of anti-clericals. Father Eusebius learned that Father Leo had informed certain priests in Chicago some time ago that he had received threatening letters. The writers declared they would kill him because of his denunciation of anarchy. Search is now being made among the effects of Father Leo for these letters.

**LOST JOB THROUGH DRINK
AND ATTEMPTED SUICIDE**

Chicago, March 17.—George B. McGuire, who said he recently had been manager of the Park and Duval hotels at Jacksonville, Fla., attempted to kill himself yesterday by jumping down an elevator shaft from the seventh floor of the Auditorium building. He landed on an ascending car at the fourth floor and was not injured seriously.

McGuire admitted that he had jumped down the shaft with suicidal intent. He was taken to the Harrison street police station, where he acted so strangely that his hands and feet were strapped to a chair to prevent him from trying again to end his life by butting his head against the walls of his cell.

In explanation of his despondency, McGuire said he had been drinking heavily for a year and his blubbery habits had caused him to lose his good position in Florida. Soon after he arrived in Chicago he became intoxicated. He will be examined by physicians at the police station today.

**ON HIS BIRTHDAY MORNING
ORCHARD GOES INTO COURT**

Boise, Ida., March 17.—Harry Orchard spent a quiet time today at the state penitentiary here, taking his usual daily exercise and spending the usual amount of time in reading. Tonight he appeared perfectly calm and in his usual spirits; he is naturally quiet and of a retiring disposition. He was absolutely no outward indication of the dread that must be in his mind of the ordeal which he must go through in the district court for Canyon county tomorrow morning, the morning of his forty-second birthday. Orchard has no statement to make on the eve of the day of his sentence for the murder of Former Governor Frank Steunenberg of this state. He disclaims that any promises of immunity or promises that any endeavor to secure immunity or commutation of sentence have been made to him. When of his own volition he changed his plea of not guilty to a plea of guilty of murder in the first degree, he told the court he fully understood what the consequences would be.

It is evident that the situation has not changed since the day he testified on cross-examination while a witness in the George A. Pettibone case, in answer to questions put by Attorney C. S. Darrow of Chicago, that he fully expected to suffer the extreme penalty of the law for his crime.
