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"It would be difficult if not impossible to devise a more inequivalent, positive or damaging system than one now in operation under the law providing for the issue, redemption and release of legal tender notes by government.

"There has never been a time of the state of the war," the speaker said, "when the gradual process of extrusion of the United States money will have been a benefit to the country, and this time when the time when the issue would not have been a harm, there would not have been a harm to the country.

"The legal tender notes were first, there is abundant reason to have that every large amount of it which has been taken from the circulation of the country, and paper in our circulation, will promptly return to take its place

through which the withdrawal was made. Many political and temporary associates may be suggested and it is with these or less responsibility, but it is the only one that will certainly move the real cause of our trouble and give assurance of permanent protection against their treatment in future.
