Judge Hatch has been working on the criminal calendar again today, and Chief Justice Morris has been assisting him, with the law and justice committee. During the forenoon, however, very little business was made in the latter division, one of the two cases heard having continued to another day.

Johnson has previously served a term in the penitentiary for one year for a similar offense in the present, and had been in the same for a short time when he again fell into bad ways. He now has the right to be set free, but he thought he would like to stay there, but by so doing he has gained little or nothing.

Judge Hatch said that a case years ago he had not been able to get a verdict for the latter party, but he now has found evidence of three years in the penitentiary.
