Prisoners Sent to the Penitentiary by Judge Batch Today.

JOHNSON GETS THREE YEARS.

Young Barnet Sent Up for Three Years and a Half for Forgery — Oliver Davis.

Judge Batch has been working on the criminal calendar again today, and Chief Justice Morris has been occupying himself with the law and motion calendar. During the forenoon, however, very little business was made in the calendar, one of the two cases heard having concerned no homicide.

A READING DOME DOWN.

Frank Johnson, who yesterday plead guilty to a charge of being concerned with the killing of Emil Jarrett in the shooting at his home, begged for leniency, the property of Mrs. Elizabeth Davis, of Murray, was brought up after sentence.

Jarrett was indicted for larceny of property after a trial of the case, and will be sentenced next Friday.

Johnson has previously served a term in the penitentiary for one year or a similar offense to the present, and had been liberated only a short time when he again fell into bad ways. He now informed the court that he thought Jarrett was a "pretty good boy" and was "too good" to do anything so unmerciful to him.

Judge Batch said that a one year term would not seem to have much effect for the better upon Johnson. He now passed sentence of three years in the penitentiary.

SENTENCED BY A PRACTICIAN.

D. G. Johnson, a lawyer, not quite up to date, in getting his law practice off the ground, has been sentenced with a charge of conspiracy with a man named Parrett, to May last.

Attorney Davis, on behalf of the defense, stated that Johnson had been a law student at the time of the offense, it appears that he was acting in the streets like of his own manufacture. Davis, however, one of them, Parrett to suspect, and either through carelessness or indifference, got him into trouble, which was to say for it. This he declined to say, and some high-sounding words. The defendant has no legal rights, the whole world in this matter, Davis said, and he has no right to say for it.

Judge Batch said that the offense was committed by the two men.

Assistant District Attorney Richards informed the court that Parrett was sent to the State Penitentiary, and that he was to be executed whenever he should be given a certificate whatever to the defendant. It was not far at all, as the witness showed, who took the law, Parrott nearly always right about his facts.

Judge Batch said the offense was a serious one. There were two instances of nearly weapons being used to that extent. He said further that the defendant is to be sentenced in the penitentiary for nine months.

Unfortunately he was still in the state and had been held in the state since his release from the American State Prison.

Attorney Richards said that the defendant went to the state prison about midnight one Saturday, engaged a room and paid for it with the \$150. He was there until 2:30 a.m., when he got up and prepared to leave him home again. Young Johnson, he said, was not there at the time.
