NATL WOOL GROWERS ASS'N.

WILL MEET IN DENVER TO ORGANIZE ANTI-TRUST COMMISSION HOUSES.

SPECIAL CORRESPONDENCE.

Cheyenne, Wyo., March 26.—There will be a meeting of the executive committee of the National Wool Growers Association, the American National Livestock association, the Corn Belt Wool Growers Association, the Western, Utah, Idaho, Montana, Arizona, and other state wool growers' associations in Denver on April 13 and 14. Plans will be formed to combat the commission houses which have raised the commission charged on sheep and hogs.

It is proposed to establish independent commission houses in Denver, South Omaha, Chicago, Sioux City, St. Joseph and Kansas City, and the associations will urge members and other stockmen to ship to these houses to the exclusion of those firms that refuse to recognize the new anti-trust commissions. Suits may also be instituted against the national and state livestock organizations against the livestock exchanges for the alleged restriction of commerce, forming trusts, etc.

The Denver meeting will be largely historical, and every western state will be represented by leading stockmen.
