

## EVELYN TO SUE FOR ANNULMENT

Inmate of Matteawan Will be  
Served With Summons  
Today

WILL DEFEND THE SUIT.

Harry K. Thaw Desires a Reconciliation,  
But the Chorus Girl-Model  
Says She Wants Bonds Severed.

New York, March 10.—Evelyn Nesbit Thaw (tomorrow will institute proceedings for the annulment of her marriage to Harry K. Thaw. The action will be based on the allegation that the defendant was insane when the union was contracted. Thaw purposes to defend the suit. The papers in the case will be served some time tomorrow and an early trial is expected. In the meantime the two by mutual agreement will remain apart.

In official statements by counsel for both parties tonight was confirmed the long-suspected culmination in the wedded lives of Stanford White's slayer and the woman whose story in his defense brought her an unhappy notoriety as wide as the reading world. For weeks it had been gossiped that a divorce was imminent and even during Thaw's last trial, throughout which his wife stood gamely by him, it was pretty generally believed that whatever the outcome for the prisoner, the two would never again live together. These reports were frequently based on rumored opposition to the young woman on the part of the Thaw family. In their statements tonight, however, counsel denied that Mrs. William Thaw, Harry's mother, had taken any part in the proposed separation.

WILL PROVIDE FOR WIFE.

During the day Col. Franklin Bartlett, counsel for the elder Mrs. Thaw, made a statement in which he said there was no truth in the report that detectives employed by Mrs. William Thaw had had her daughter-in-law under surveillance for months. As to a possible separation Col. Bartlett said: "The matter is inchoate. There is every disposition on the part of my client to be absolutely fair and just toward Evelyn Thaw and to make liberal provision for her support and even more than that. Harry K. Thaw has sought a reconciliation and has not desired that his wife should leave him, but she desires a permanent severance of the marital relation. Any thought of espionage upon the young Mrs. Thaw would be abhorrent to Mrs. William Thaw and has not at any time been entertained by her."

CONFERENCE OF ATTORNEYS.  
Soon after Col. Bartlett's interview became public, A. Russell Peabody, personal counsel to Thaw, left for Matteawan, where since his last trial Thaw has been confined in the asylum for the criminal insane. After a talk with his client, Mr. Peabody returned to the city late today and by appointment met Daniel O'Reilly, one of Thaw's former attorneys, who is now counsel for Evelyn Thaw. The conference extended well into the evening and at its conclusion Mr. O'Reilly said:

"Papers will be served on Mr. Peabody tomorrow by me as counsel for Evelyn Thaw in an action for annulment of the marriage. The plan will be on the ground that at the time of the marriage, April 4, 1905, Harry Thaw was insane, and did not know what he was doing."

"This action has been thought of for some time. It will be tried in New York county. As yet no mention has been made of any settlement in favor of Evelyn. If after the annulment proceedings are through and they are in favor of the plaintiff, some action might be taken for the recovery of counsel fees and alimony."

THAW WILL DEFEND.

Mr. Peabody, who had heard O'Reilly's remarks, said:

"Today I have visited Harry at Matteawan and told him the intentions of his wife. He is willing to defend the suit."

when apprised of his wife's intentions, had made no comment except to declare that he was sane at the time of his marriage, and expressed his willingness to meet the issue.

Asked whether Mrs. William Thaw was active in the planner litigation, Mr. Peabody replied:

"No, she is not."

Mr. O'Reilly added to his formal statement that Evelyn would take the stand during the annulment proceedings and that several of the medical experts who had testified at the murder trial would also be called. He added that despite his announced determination to defend the suit, he believed that Thaw would put no serious obstacle in the way of separation. If Thaw would be so good as to appear before the court, he felt toward his wife for the aid she had rendered him when he was on trial for his life. As to his client's financial resources, O'Reilly said he thought she had funds enough to maintain her during the trial of the case. He added that for the future, he was capable of earning a large income as a writer.

Both lawyers emphatically denied that Evelyn had been followed by detectives or that she had made any demand upon her husband's mother for a money settlement.

DEPEND ON INSANITY.

It is understood that the attorneys for Mrs. Thaw will depend upon the evidence of insanity introduced at the last trial of Thaw to prove that he was mentally incompetent at the time he legally contracted a marriage. Should this be established, the case would be won for the plaintiff, providing there was no introduction of the defense that Thaw subsequently recovered full possession of his faculties and, by consequence, the marriage relation, gave validity to the original contract. This point the attorneys would not discuss tonight. It was, however, pointed out that Thaw, though committed to an insane asylum as having been insane at the time he killed White, has not been declared insane at the present time. Whether the matter of his insanity will be determined before the trial for annulment is not known. If it is not, there will be added interest in the probable effect of the proceedings upon the later efforts to get Thaw out of the asylum.

## HARRY ORCHARD PLEADS GUILTY

Will Be Sentenced for Murder of  
Governor Steunenberg Next  
Wednesday.

CAUSED GREAT SURPRISE.

Man Whose Confessions Reeked With  
Bloody Details Startles Court and  
Spectators by His Announcement.

Boise, Idaho, March 10.—The last chapter of the famous Frank Steunenberg murder case was begun this morning when in the district court for Canyon county at Caldwell, Harry Orchard, whose startling confession made public in February, 1907, caused the arrest of Charles H. Moyer and William D. Haywood, president and secretary of the Western Federation of Miners, and George Pettibone, honorary member of that organization, and the subsequent trials of the latter two, faced Judge Fremont Wood and pleaded guilty to the charge of murder in the first degree.

Pending and during the trial of Haywood and Pettibone the trial of Harry Orchard had been postponed from term to term in the Canyon county court until, after Pettibone had been acquitted last January and Moyer soon after dismissed upon motion of the prosecuting attorney, it was definitely stated that Orchard's case would be called for final disposition this March term.

PLEA A SURPRISE.

There has been a great deal of speculation as to how Orchard would conduct himself when arraigned at this time. Jurors in the trials of Haywood and Pettibone refused to believe his tale of crimes committed at the instigation of the officers of the federation. They were all freed. After that the opinion was expressed in many quarters that Orchard would take advantage of every legal right he might have to obtain his own release or a light sentence.

He stood he took this morning was a surprise to most every one and his attorney says, was entirely voluntary on his part and against the advice of many who had seen and talked with him. It is known that strong influence had been exerted upon Orchard in the past few weeks to get the man to stand by the plea of "not guilty" and stand trial.

FEW IN COURT.

There were few persons in the court room this morning. Orchard was taken to Caldwell on the interurban line from the penitentiary in Boise in charge of Warden Whitney and a guard. On the same car were his attorney, Frank T. Wyman of this city, and Judge Wood of the Ada county district court. Orchard was appointed by Judge Bryan to sit in the cases growing out of the Steunenberg murder before he himself was disqualified, having been indicted by the grand jury, appeared by appointment of the court as attorney for Orchard.

The case was called at 10 o'clock and Mr. Wyman at once asked the court that Orchard desired to withdraw the plea of not guilty which had been entered in his case upon his first arraignment by the court and enter a plea of guilty instead to the charges in the indictment.

MIND FULLY MADE UP.

Judge Wood questioned Orchard as to whether he fully understood the status of the case, what it meant for him to plead guilty and if he understood, Orchard said "guilty" and the charges in the indictment meant pleading guilty to the charge of first degree murder.

Perfectly calm, with no indication of any emotion in face or voice, Orchard answered that he had gone over the matter thoroughly with his attorney and had made up his mind definitely. Judge Wood asked the plea to be changed and set date for sentence for Wednesday, March 18, at 10 a. m.

Harry Orchard was born March 13, 1886. The crime for which Orchard has been held was committed on the eve of Dec. 30, 1905, when ex-Gov. Frank Steunenberg was blown to eternity while passing through the gate leading to his home in Caldwell by the explosion of a dynamite bomb. Orchard was arrested two days later and placed in the state penitentiary for safe keeping. Early in February the news was given out that he had made a confession which implicated Haywood, Moyer and Pettibone and others in the Steunenberg murder and in a series of most horrible crimes in Colorado. The three men in Denver were arrested and brought to Idaho and Haywood and Pettibone, after long delay, tried and acquitted separately. The case against Moyer was afterwards dismissed.

## FOR SCHOOL FIRE FINDS NO EXCUSE

Coroner Burke Declares Particular  
Built in Hall Caused  
Loss of Life.

Cleveland, March 10.—"The loss of the lives of the little children in the Collinwood school fire was absolutely execrable," Coroner Burke declared today, after making a thorough investigation.

"The poor little children were caught in a veritable trap and held and crushed until burned to death," he said. "Some one is responsible for this and should be held. I am not prepared yet to say upon whom the blame should be placed. Before I can charge anyone with this horrible responsibility I must review the evidence carefully and deliberately. I find that the steam pipes caused the fire by being placed close to the children. There is no doubt in my mind that the overheated pipes caused the fire."

But the children should have escaped and would have done so had it not been for the partition built in the hall at the foot of the stairway. This is what caused their death."

The coroner said that the building was also deficient in the automatic devices for opening of doors.

Another body was recovered from the ruins today, making the total 166.

## CRUISER ALBANY WINS THE TROPHY

Exceeds All Previous Records for  
Speed and Accuracy  
In Firing.

BUILT IN GREAT BRITAIN.

With Her Sister Ship, the New Orleans, She Was Purchased Before Spanish-American War.

Washington, March 10.—Unofficial information which has reached the navy department shows that greater speed and accuracy in firing has been attained during the target practice this year than ever before. The trophy which the Albany proudly displays was won last year by the Boston. Since then the Boston has been placed out of commission and her officers and men transferred to the Albany. They were allowed to take the trophy with them.

BUILT IN ENGLAND.  
The Albany was built in Great Britain for the Brazilian government, but before her completion was purchased by the United States, together with her sister ship, the New Orleans. The latter ship was turned over to this government at the outbreak of the Spanish war, but the Albany was not completed in time for service in that war.

The performance at Magdalena bay shows that the Albany has broken all records for rapidity and accuracy with her five-inch guns, her average being 10 hits per minute, and the St. Louis, with her six-inch guns, averaging eight and three-quarters hits per minute.

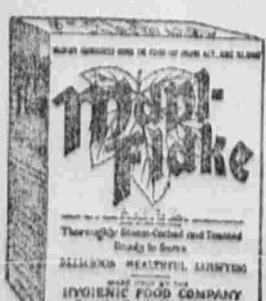
