BEET DIGGING DISCONTINUED

Storm Makes Farm Work Impossible and Roads Impassable—R. R. Traffic Affected.

SESSION OF CITY COUNCIL

Nominee Resigns—Grizzly Bear Bagged—Police Court Notes—New Amusement Houses.

Ogden, Oct. 20.—During the past four days the beet growers of this district have been unable to get their beets to the factory on account of the inclement weather. On Thursday of last week the farmers had to cease digging beets in this district as the roads throughout the county were almost impassable. The factory is running on beets that have been stored in the bins and that are being received from the northern part of Salt Lake valley and in some parts of Weber county where the beets were already dug an effort will be made to get them to the factory immediately.

The Logan and Lewiston factories are having no difficulty at present in keeping good supplies of beets on hand. While the roads in Cache valley have been somewhat broken up by the heavy traffic it has not been such as to interfere with the getting of the beets to the factories.

HEAVY SNOWSTORMS.

Advices received at the headquarters of the Ogden division of the Union Pacific railroad yesterday afternoon stated that a heavy snowstorm was raging in western Wyoming which would probably cause a great deal of delay to trains. The storm which struck Ogden yesterday afternoon was the first snow of the year to fall in the valley. For more than two weeks the hills and mountains have been covered with snow. From reports received at the railroad offices the storm of last night was general throughout the Intermountain region.

CITY COUNCIL SESSION.

Mayor's Veto Sustained—Immorality Commended—Committee Named.

Ogden, Oct. 20.—At the city council session last night a lively discussion was had on the necessity of clearing out the immorality existing in "Electric" alley.

After considerable heated discussion, the veto of Mayor Brewer of a liquor license to Ed Walton, a negro, was sustained by a tie vote.

The veto of Mayor Brewer of an estimate amounting to \$6,925.61, allowed to Contractor McLean for street work, was also sustained. It was explained that the funds for this purposes had been exhausted. The city treasurer was ordered to proceed to collect the special levy on abutting property owners for the payment of this amount.

On motion of Councilman Thomas, President Browning appointed a special committee, consisting of Councilmen Peery, Humphries, Dickson, Flygar and Thomas, to take charge of the affairs of the newly-purchased water-works system until a commission for this purpose is provided for by legislative enactment.

A number of petitions from residents of the city, asking for improvements of streets and sidewalks, with the reports from various city officials, were read and acted upon. Payrolls amounting to \$1,705.34 were allowed.

DEATH OF YOUNG MOTHER.

The funeral services over the body of Mrs. Martha A. Hansen, wife of Louis A. Hansen, who died at the Ogden general hospital yesterday of peritonitis, will be held from the Presbyterian meetinghouse at 2 o'clock Wednesday afternoon.

The young woman has been ill for about three weeks and was taken to the hospital last Friday and operated upon for appendicitis, and hopes for her recovery entertained until late Sunday evening, when she took a change for the worse and gradually began growing weaker until the end came.

The deceased was born in Warren, this county, June 2, 1877, and was the daughter of Joseph and Ann Waymont. She is survived by her husband and four small children besides her parents, brothers and sisters, and a very large circle of relatives and friends. The body was removed to the Larkin undertaking parlors where it was prepared for burial and removed to the home of Joseph Waymont in Warren, where the remains may be viewed on the day of the funeral up to the hour of 1 o'clock.

CANNOT FIND RELATIVES.

Up to a late hour last evening all efforts to locate the relative of Gordon Grant, who died Saturday evening from injuries received as the result of being struck by a runaway horse, had proved fruitless. It is positively known that he has a mother and brother residing in Boston, but the chief of police of that city, together with members of the Masonic and Elk lodges have failed thus far to locate them.

NOMINEE RESIGNS.

John Wintle has resigned as the nominee for county clerk on the Democratic ticket and John A. Junk has been named in his stead. The certificate of the nomination was filed with the county clerk yesterday afternoon.

POLICE COURT.

In the police court before Judge Murphy, K. Nakiyama, a Japanese bartender at the White Ship saloon on Third street, was fined \$15 for selling liquor to a couple of minors. In passing the sentence the court took advantage of the temperance question and delivered a long talk upon it. One or two other cases for the violation of the Sunday closing law were handled in like manner by his honor.

This morning Judge Murphy held a very busy session when, among other things, he assessed against four gambling houses and a number of other low resorts.

GRIZZLY BEAR BAGGED.

A grizzly bear weighing about 600 pounds was brought to Ogden yesterday afternoon by Martin Johnson of Huntsville. The bear was sold to a local butcher shop. The hide, which was sold to a local sportsman, was seven feet in length and was one of the finest specimens ever exhibited in this city. The animal was killed by Johnson at a point about three miles southwest of Huntsville.

NEW AMUSEMENT HOUSES.

As was announced in the "News" several days ago, the actual construction work has commenced upon the new moving picture house which is to be erected on Washington avenue south of the Grand Opera house by W. E. Newman and associates and which is to cost \$10,000.

The new building will occupy the ground upon which the Newman tin shop stood and about 30 feet additional on the north side of the building. Mr. Newman has moved his tin shop into the building adjoining the proposed theater. To a representative of the "News," yesterday afternoon, W. F. Normandy, who has an interest in the new theater with Mr. Newman stated that it was their purpose to make it one of the best in the state and would surpass anything in the moving picture house line in Salt Lake city or Ogden.

The seating capacity of the house will be 700 and it will be modern throughout, and will open December 1.

Yesterday the Critchlow Investment company accepted the plans submitted by P. C. Woods & Co., architects, for a Spanish theater to be erected between the Reed hotel and the Opera House block. The amount of the architect's fee on the building will be called the Alhambra. It will cost \$10,000. The house will have a seating capacity of 600. The building which will be erected for the Alhambra Theater company will be thoroughly modern throughout. The ground for the foundation was broken yesterday morning.

Tomorrow night the members of the order of Shriners from throughout the Intermountain region will gather in Ogden for the purpose of escorting a class of 30 novices across the burning sands and initiating them into the mysteries of the shrine.

The "session" closes with a banquet in the evening.

Gasoline Motor Car—Supt. Whitney of the Ogden division of the Union Pacific yesterday afternoon received from Omaha a gasoline motor car, which will be used in the future for short trips and inspection, on the track.
