HEARING POSTPONED

One Week, in the Case of Captain Doane.

As stated in last evening's News would very likely be the case, the hearing of Captain Doane's case was postponed for another week, in account of the absence of Commissioner Noble, who is now in Wyoming.

With this exception, all hands were on deck and the hearing would have gone on, had not Senator's counsel interposed a strong objection, claiming that justice or a construction of the law was necessary to determine an officer, the trial could not be pronounced.

Commissioner Noble stated that he had addressed a communication to Mr. Naylor of Laramie, Wyoming, but it has not yet been received, and the letter which will have received him.

Attorney General as prosecutor desired to proceed with the hearing as there were a number of witnesses present from Memphis and he did not want to postpone it.

After further discussion it was agreed to adjourn the hearing for one week, and at the request of Mr. Naylor, Mr. Tracy and Mr. Naylor came to Salt Lake City.

Redemption of Tax Sales.

There has been filed in the office of County Clerk Stansbury, a recapitulation of redemptions from tax sales of the year 1885 up to August 20, 1886.

The report is as follows: For the year 1885 the total paid are \$17,338.65 with \$7,706.17 interest, and \$1,945.25 costs, making a total of \$22,000.00. This amount is divided as follows: City, \$1,200.00; city county, \$1,000.00; county, \$6,422.31; county schools, \$2,000.00; the remainder being divided among the remainder districts.

For the year 1884 the report is thus: Total, \$64,237.11; interest, \$22,000.00; costs, \$1,000.00; county, \$1,000.00; county schools, \$1,000.00; city, \$1,000.00; city county, \$6,520.00; county schools, \$2,000.00; territory, \$20,000.00; the remainder going to several districts.

FREIGHTS TO SALT LAKE.

The Union Pacific and Rio Grande Western across the Southern Pacific of Sharp Practices.

San Francisco Examiner of Sunday: Arrangements are being made for an important meeting of transcontinental freight officials at Salt Lake City. The merchants of Zion are very anxious of getting the benefit of certain reduced rates the Southern Pacific company recently put into effect from San Francisco to Ogden. When the new rates were announced, the Salt Lake people were very indignant with the Southern Pacific for what appeared to them to be a discrimination in favor of Ogden that would promote the rival city's trade at their expense. Some sharp correspondence ensued between the "Mormons" association and the Salt Lake and Northern Pacific officials that was taking ground so that they did not want a road into Salt Lake, they could not afford that place the same rates as Ogden unless the Union Pacific and Rio Grande Western would work with the Southern Pacific at Ogden and run to Salt Lake, would join them in making the Ogden rates applicable to Salt Lake. These two roads declined, on the authority of Pacific representatives, to do this, and the result was that those that run to Ogden have been urging the other companies to join the Southern Pacific in giving them the same rates on shipments from San Francisco as Ogden

can.
