Washington, Feb. 8.—C. W. Post of Battle Creek, Mich., who has interested himself largely in the establishment of a parcels post system, today filed with President Pro Tem. Frye of the senate a petition for the expulsion of Senator Thomas C. Platt from the senate.

The petition is based on the assertion that Mr. Platt, as the executive officer of the United States Express company, is a party to a conspiracy to maintain identical rates among express companies for articles shipped over their lines, and he asserts that Platt has told representatives of his that he will oppose all legislation injuriously affecting his company's interests.
