LOCAL BRIEFS.

George P. Garff and Reginald Garff were tried a second time at Draper yesterday, and this time acquitted, on a charge of stealing irrigation water belonging to Jackson R. Allen.

The county commissioners have appointed Dr. W. E. Forrester of Murray, health officer of district No. 2, to serve for the next two years. This completes the health board which will be called into session at 11 o'clock Saturday.

The officers at Fort Douglas missed Private Hinkulstein of the Twenty-third Infantry yesterday afternoon and at about the same time they missed a number of rifles including a revolver. Later in the day the revolver was found in a pawn shop having been left there by a soldier answering Hinkulstein's description. A search has been instituted for the private but he has not been discovered yet.

Certificates of incorporation of the Wilford and South Jordan wards of the corporations of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints have been filed with the secretary of state. The Wilford corporation was filed by Bishop J. D. Cummings, the property being valued at \$5,000. The South Jordan corporation's property is estimated at \$2,000. Bishop Thomas Blake filed the certificate.

WAS A HUMMER

Barbecued Beef for 6,000 People at Lagoon Yesterday.

SPORTS AND A BABY SHOW.

Road Race Was Won by Homes in Splendid Time—Baseball Game and Racing Contests.

Yesterday the butchers of Salt Lake and Ogden held their second annual love feast at Lagoon. The butchers with their families make quite a respectable crowd, but when it came to the addition of their friends the crowd grew into a multitude. In all there were close upon 6,000 people who bought tickets to the resort, and as a consequence the residents along Third West as far south as the Salt Lake & Ogden depot were kept awake until nearly 2 o'clock this morning by the heavily loaded trains of tired picknickers as they returned to the city. In addition to the Salt Lake contingent a special train from Ogden over the Short Line also brought down 1,000 excursionists to swell the numbers at the resort.

It was a joyous occasion and there was fun and amusement enough for all during the live long day. Naturally, the barbecued beef was the chief attraction, and the counter for "a little piece of the top; not rare, please," was a sight not to be forgotten. George Newland, clad in all the pomp and glory of the regulars, led the parade, followed by the committee in attending to the wants of the sandwich rustlers, and a right royally did he entertain them. It was a veritable case of feed the multitude, and it was not a case of giving the section of soule coo, either, the meat was luscious, juicy and the best that there was to be had.

Gastronomic feats, however, were not the only contests of the day. The fun started early in the morning, and the resort was reached in the form of a ten-mile road race.
