AN ORDINANCE

Relating to the Control and Distribution of the waters flowing into Salt Lake City.

Section 1.—Be it ordained by the City Council of Salt Lake City, that the city watermaster shall have the honor and duty to see that the waters flowing into said city shall be as fixed by order of the city council, and he shall have authority to appoint, subject to the approval of the city council, assistant watermasters; resident within the city, who shall receive from him a certificate of appointment, and shall act in his name and for whose official conduct he shall be responsible.

Section 2.—The period of artificial irrigation shall be deemed to commence annually on the first day of April and end the first day of November.

Section 3.—Before the 15th day of March in each year every person entitled to use a portion of the waters flowing into said city for irrigation shall present to the city watermaster a form provided by said watermaster for that purpose, a written application for the use of water as aforesaid, certifying that the foregoing is a full, true and correct copy of an Ordinance relating to the control and distribution of the waters flowing into Salt Lake City, passed by the City Council of said city on the 4th day of March, A. D. 1879, as appears of record in my office.

Section 4.—In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed the corporate seal of Salt Lake City, this 5th day of March, A. D. 1879.

Section 5.—Before the 15th day of April in each year, every person entitled to use a portion of the waters flowing into said city for irrigation shall present to the city watermaster a form provided by said watermaster for that purpose, a written application for the use of water as aforesaid, certifying that the foregoing is a full, true and correct copy of an Ordinance relating to the control and distribution of the waters flowing into Salt Lake City, passed by the City Council of said city on the 4th day of March, A. D. 1879, as appears of record in my office.

Section 6.—If any person shall fail to comply with the provisions of this ordinance, he shall be deemed to have forfeited his right to the use of the waters flowing into said city for irrigation, and he shall be liable to a fine of fifty dollars, or to both fine and imprisonment, at the discretion of the city council.
