JOINT BUILDING PLANS.

Approved by the City Council at a Special Meeting Last Night.

THE SPECIFICATIONS AND DESIGN.

The Cost of the Building Not to Exceed \$150,000.

An inmate of St. Mary's Hospital attempts to sever his throat With a knife.

The outside crisis is extending with alarming rapidity. Successful and unsuccessful attempts at self-destruction have been made at the rate of one per day for the last eight days in this territory.

The last would-be-taker of his own life, as far as known, is an inmate of St. Mary's Hospital in this city, named John Evertt. He was born in England and taken to the hospital to undergo treatment for insanity. He has been here for three years. He has been married since his arrival, and has a wife in America. He repeatedly writes asking her to join him, and offering to send the money necessary to support his wife. His letters were unanswered, so he wrote again, adding that he had been married more than three years ago. They had been married about two years, and he had written to his wife, saying that he was in America, and that he was married. His wife, however, did not receive his letter, and he has been separated from his wife since his arrival.

An inquest was held by Coroner Hartz last night, at the undertaking parlor of S. D. Evans, over the body of Michael O'Brien, who was drowned in one of the Warm Springs plunge pools yesterday while bathing. It was learned that the deceased came from Huron, Ohio, about six weeks ago, and has been registered at the White House in this city ever since. Yesterday morning he made an voluntary visit to the Springs, and in company with three friends, entered the water. He was swimming, and was said to be quite strong, but became unconscious, and was pulled ashore.
