AN OLD GRAND JURY.

HOW IT RECOMMENDED JAMES ROSS AS A CANDIDATE FOR GOVERNOR.

The following report of a grand jury in the "olden time," may be of interest to our readers. It was handed to us by the Hon. Samuel H. Russell, and was found by him among his father's papers, who was foreman of the first grand jury held in this country.

"It is at all times the duty, and should at all times be the study of freedom in their elections to make choice of such characters as are best qualified to execute the laws; but never can this duty be made imperative, nor a choice fraught with consequences of such moment, as at our next election for the governor of this Commonwealth.

A State which ranks among the foremost of the Union, deeply interested in the general welfare, calculated to command the respect of all her sister States by her situation and the political attitude she might assume, Pennsylvania the sport of foreign influence and torn by consequent domestic faction, misled by cunning and calumniating men, constantly setting herself in opposition to the general government, and pursuing a system of politics unwisely, the most inconsistent with the truest interests, therefore her peace continually disquieted, her prosperity brought into peril and her own rank and importance in the Union exceedingly impaired.

Oppressed with these considerations, and anxious that our State should regain her political consequence and no longer persevere in measures from which she has reaped nothing but disgrace, that she could go hand-in-hand with the general government and by the most upright and salutary counsel seek to promote her own best interests, we, the grand jury of the County of York, as the most likely way to secure these inalienable blessings, beg leave to recommend James Ross, of Allegheny County, as the most proper person to be chosen governor of this State at our next election.

"He is a native of this county and his parents and relatives reside among us. A noble in his manners, of a plain but dignified deportment, and of an unblemished character, possessing the confidence of his country, he was elected a member of the State Convention that framed our present Constitution, and has been twice chosen by our Legislature a Senator of the United States. Blessed with a sound mind, with honest, independent principles, and unconnected with any foreign minister, it is not likely that he will favor more money than is necessary to the interest of our country, or become the dupe of boisterous demagogues.

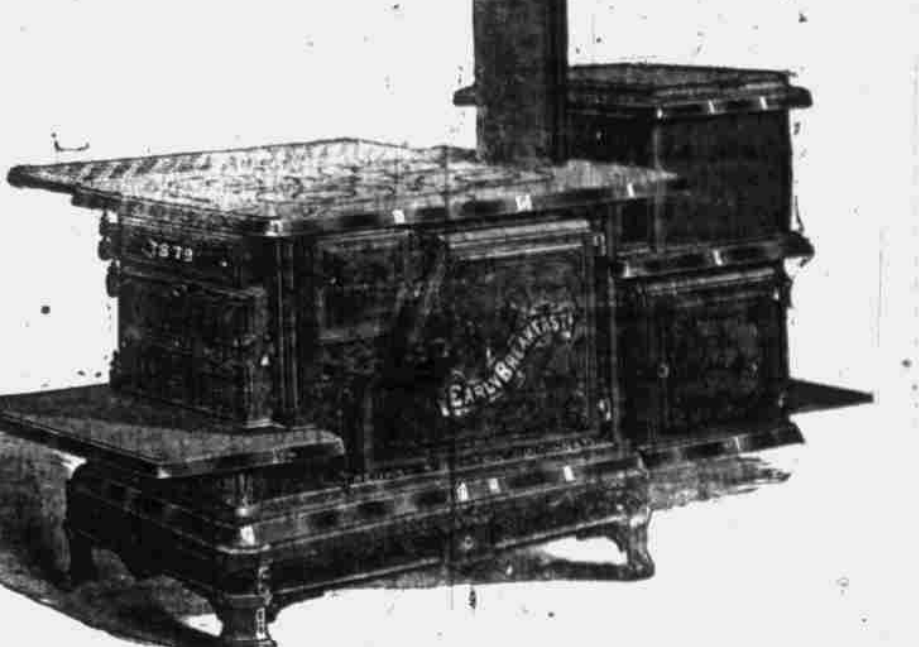
