The sus-rension and formal rebuke of M. Zuraboft, however, was pronounced by the president of the chamber, but this failed to satisfy the ministers, who subsequently ordered the govern-ment experts to withdraw from the evening session of the budget session. Immediately after adjournment Premier Stolypin summoned an extra-ordinary session of the cabinet which apparently brought matters to an is-sue between the premier and the re-

ue between the premier and the re-ctionary members of his ministry. What transpired is not known, but a

actionary members of his ministry. What transpired is not known, but at middight Premier Stolypin summoned M. Golovin and informed him that the incident had caused serious fric-tion in the cabinet. He hoped, how-ever, a way would be found tomor-row to arrange matters without fatal consequences to the doutna. The early discussion of the army bill in the doutna today was stormy, but the culmination came at ~ 30 this evening, when M. Zuraboff made his speech. President Golovin, when he restored things to a semblance of or-der, attempted to explain away Zura-boff's words as a criticism of the old army under the old regime, both of which had passed away. He then suspended the session for 10 minutes in order to allow the passions of the members to cool. The recess was protracted for al-most two hours while a series of weighty conferences were being held and reports were telephoned to Stoly-pin and the emperor. Finally Lieut-Gen. Rudiger, minister of war, an-nounced the ministerial ultimatum, adding that the emperor would never stand such insults to his faithful army. When the house reassembled M.
