SAMUEL BROWN departed this life Sep. 18th, 1882, at Payson, Utah County, Utah. Born Feb. 1st, 1801, in Vermont. He was baptized into the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints at the early age and was a member of the First Quorum of Seventies organized by Joseph Smith. Was a doorkeeper in Kirtland Temple. Was a member of Z. C. Camp. Has been with the Church in all the drivings, mobbings and persecutions. Traveled and preached the Gospel a great deal. Was never known to falter or deny the truth.

Services were held in Payson meeting-house, Sep. 14th, at 3:30 p.m. The speakers were Elders H. G. Woyle and L. O. A. Colvin, who said Brother Brown was a worthy Latter-day Saint and a useful life of over four score years.—[Com.]
