DEBUT OF THE NEWS BUREAU,

Washington, Dec. 18.—(Special)—
The House resumed the consideration
of the Utah bill at 10 o'clock.

Newlands of Nevada introduced the
measure of the bill and gave it a speech
in behalf of irrigation and the free
usage of silver. His time was ex-
ceeded by request of Reed, and he
made a rattling speech.

Jerry Simpson advocated the bill
and denounced the opposition with
being in league with the monarchical
to keep down western representa-
tives in Congress. In order to maintain

effect.

The galleries were well filled and
there was much interest manifested in
the City's question.

The vote will be taken at 4 o'clock.
Oates, of Louisiana, made a speech
in favor of the admission of Utah, but
vetoed the union of Utah and
Nevada.

At 2:30 Rawlins obtained unanimous
consent for the reading of the bill by voice.

Moore, of New York, offered an
amendment referring to the Federal
government the power to execute
penal institutions in cases of polygamy.

Poor, of Vermont, offered a similar
amendment to another section.

Maline's amendment was voted
down, and motion to the House,
the members gathered in squads over
the chamber.

Poor got the floor in behalf of his
amendment, and it was voted down.
McDowell, of Iowa, favored the passage
of the bill and said that he felt authorized
to voice the will of the Republican
party that Utah should become a state.
Poor's amendment was modified
and adopted unanimously.

HALLIGATE!

A quarter before noon o'clock the
House arose and reported the bill for
passage with amendment.

Wheeler, of Alabama, moved the
passage of the bill and demanded the
division question.

The House voted two more. There
was a full roll of both sides and only
two votes in the negative, one from
each side.

The Utah statehood bill was de-
clared passed.

in delivering his able speech last even-

times.
