

# IN CONGRESSMAN HOWELL'S COUNTY

How the Battle Waged in and About the Towns Where He Lived.

## MANY RETURNS IN DETAIL.

The Unofficial Caucass Shows Republicans Gains in Nearly All of the Precincts.

The detailed returns from the different Cache county towns, the former citadels of the Democracy in Northern Utah, are coming into the Desert News from its army of correspondents, as they came from its representatives in other towns of the state today. A study of these returns is interesting even to those who were defeated. The Cache county towns that were not reported yesterday are found in today's issue of the "News." They are as follows:

### NEWTON.

The town polled 395 votes, which were divided almost equally between the two parties. The Republican candidate for sheriff received a majority. A Democratic justice of the peace and a Republican constable were elected, while the National Republican ticket and Democratic state ticket received majorities. The vote stands as follows:
