BEST METHODS OF MARKETING APPLES.

The following timely paper was read by Henry M. Dunlap, an Illinois applegrower, before the recent American Appla Growers' Congress;

The best asset to have in marketing an apple crop is good fruit. With this to an apple crop is good fruit. With this to start with, the rest is comparatively easy. It is then the essential thing to do your level best to raise such 1, ult. This requires good varieties, such as are in good demand and are the least susceptible to seab, rungi, worms, bitter rot and the elements. Spray in the most up-fo-date mather, with materials so campounded as to give least injury to the f.u.t, clean and careful culture and juditious pruning.

CAREFUL PACKING IMPORTANT.

CAREFUL PACKING IMPORTANT. In selling the winter apple crop, that way is the best which best fits your con-ditions. If you are not an expert pack-er, it will be well for you to seil them picked down, or on the tree, as may be agreed upon, and then thre out to the buyer to assist him in packing, so that another season, with your expedence gained under expert instruction, you may be able to sell the fruit barreled and on board cars with only the supervision of the buyer or his representative to over-lock the packing from time to time. You can always handle the packing cheaper than can the buyer, who comes in from the outside, and he will be willing to give a higher price to have it done for him provided it is done to his satisfaction. It would not be possible under present conditions of pulling fut instead of picking, as nearly all of us as growers are guilty of, even up to the present time.
