WASHINGTON, May 29, 1876.
Page introduced
bill providing for the

repeal of the national bank
notes, payable in gold at the San

Francisco Sub-Treasury.

Adams offered the following
pre-emptive and resolution:

"Whereas, the fact is apparent
that the branches of the man-

ufacturing, mechanical and mining
industries are at this time

depressed, and that all legislation
which tends to embarrass or

the unsettling of values or the
repeal of the manufacturing, mech-

anical or mining operations un-
certain, is unwise and injudicious;

Therefore,

Resolved, That in the judgment
of this House, legislation affecting

tariff is at this time inexpedient.

The previous question having
been ordered, the yeas and nays

were taken, and it was
recorded, yeas 119, nays 95.

Morrison then rose to debate
the bill, and he said he had
