In Naval Parade Will be Sixty of World's Most Powerful Vessels of War.

ARRANGING FOR VISITORS

More Than 200 Doctors and Unward-Of a Thousand Nurses Mready Engaged.

New York, Sept. 27-With the expeeted arrival within a few hours of the British and German muadrons of war versels, the International nava representation at the Hudson-Folto: celebration, which commences Saturday, will be about complete. The English warships were groping their way through the fog off the Long Island coust at daylight today.

The Germans are on their way from

The Germans are on their way from Newport. In the naval parade Safurday the replicas of the Haif Moon and the Chr-mont will be escoried by more than to of the world's most powerful war ves-sels, by 150 private steam vanits, and more than 300 gaily-decorated ships. At night this parade will be repeated under the Illumination of the most re-markable pyrotechnic display ever demärkable pyrotechnic display ever de signed. Even nature will contribute its fitting share, for on that night there promises to be a perfect half-moon in the sky, pointing the way for the Hall Moon of old Holland.

Arrangements to handle the shorm-ous crowds are engaging public officials and the celebration committee. More than 300 doctors and upwards of 1.000 purses have been engaged already to than 300 doctors and upwards of 1.000 nurses have been engaged already to attend 23 field hospitals and 150 first-ald stations. Assisting these and the police will be many scores of litterpolice will be many scores of litter-bearers, a dozen or more swift motor ambulance hunches and all of the available privats ambulances in the city. All hospitals in the city have made arrangements to facilitate the handling of emergency cases day and elect. light

All churches along and near the line of march will remain open day and night as rest stations for the wear;

Pearing that many thousands of vis-tors will be without hotel accommoda itors will be without holei accommoda-tions, a special committee is obtain-ing a list of bourding houses and pri-vate houses where strangers may be accommodated with a night's lodging It is expected that such accommoda-tions will be found for fully half a sufficiency and the list accommode tions will be found for fully half a million persons and this list, arranged by location, will be distributed freely from dozens of information hureaus which are being established where the largest crowds will congregate. The city is rapidly filling with vis-itors from all sections and as far west as the Mississippi valley. All railroads are doubling their num-her of incoming trains, and it is es-

per of incoming trains, and it is es-timated that already there are between 250,090 and 200,000 Hudson-Fulten vistors here, besides the usual quarter of a million non-residents who are ai-ways in New York.
