**Dan Hunt Run Down and Fatally Hurt  
By a Frightened Team.**

Boise, Ida., April 23.—Dan Hunt of that firm of Nichols & Hunt, brick-makers,

This struck Hunt on the back of the head, bringing him to the ground with terrific force. Upon striking the man, Hunt, his horse and the wagon rolled over, which passed over his breast and collar bone, crushing them completely.
