Councilman Evans was chosen chairman of the meeting to the claims of President Lambeth. The members present were: Summit, Rich, Palmer, Harris, Hart, Lovens, Kelly, Bertram, Price, Morris, W. H. Smith, Lambeth, Evans, and Mr. Blair, who had come to the meeting.

A communication from Mr. V. L. Blair and seventy-eight weeks was read.
