RAILROAD IN PALESTINE.

A PRIVATE correspondent from Jaffa, Palestine, Mr. J. F. Dieterle, states, in a letter dated June 23rd, that the long-talked-of railroad between Jaffa and Jerusalem is to be finished in the course of two years from now. The work of grading is progressing speedily. The first locomotive ever seen in the Holy Land is expected in Jaffa this month, from New York. There is also some prospect of a railroad between Haifa and Damascus. English syndicate with a capital of some millions of francs are interested in this work. As the present Sultan of Constantiuople has shown himself favorable to reforms, it is thought likely that his vast deminions will be opened by degrees to the influx of occidental civilization.

ORGANIZATION AND DISINTE-GRATION.

When the objects seem to be achieved the associations split and its fragments reorganize in order to make war upon each other for possession of the spoils. This is where organization disorganizes. In fact some extensive compacts are entered into for the purpose of creating disintegration, such for instance is the purpose of the Nibilists and the votaries of extreme socialism.

When one contemplates the state of the world from this standpoint, he is filled with wonder, and with no small degree of sadness, as it takes no great amount of foresight to anticipate the natural result of the tendency of the times-riot, confusion, bloodshed and strife such as the earth never has before witnessed. There is scarcely a subject now into which the combination spirit does not enter, or that does not have the disintegrating result as its philosophical outcome. The only comfort one can draw from the aspect of affairs is that out of the future chaos will come a more perfect organization, permanent peace and prosperity than have ever yet blessed the world.

It is inspired by the latest movement in Russia against the Jewish residents of that country which practically threatens them because of the ban under which it is proposed to place them. Now comes a proposal for a combination of the Hebrews throughout the baiance of the world in their strong financial capacity to boycott the dominion of the Czar unless more humane treatment be accorded their brethren.

This is indeed a unique proposition, but should it be put in operation its result would doubtless be the opposite to the one desired in making it. Such a boycott would cause distress in portions of Russia, whose industries would be crippled by the inauguration of the adverse movement on the part of the Jews throughout the earth. Whatever of disaster was thus presipitated would arouse popular rage and bring about a popular assault against the Hebrews in that country that would cause their brethren to wish they had never taken the step to exasperate the Sclavic people of the Czar against the remnauts of the ancient people of

There is hardly any evil that is wholly unmixed with good. Who is able to say that the inimical attitude of the Czar and his Sclavic subjects toward the Jews will not be a factor in hastening the time when the latter will be glad to return to the land of their fathers, begin to establish themselves as an individualized nationality and build Jerusalem on its former site? The time is at hand when that marvelous work must begin on an extensive scale, and the signs seem to be distinctly pointing in that direction.

One feature of the proposed Hebrew boycott of Russia is somewhat suggestive. It shows that even in their scattered condition the Jews are a power in the world. This is necessarily the case, because they have a strong pull on the purse strings of the earth. As gold is the god of the world, the world is necessarily influenced by those who possess to a remarkable extent the deity at whose shrine they worship. The very proposition to assume the attitude referred to in regard to Russia is an evidence of the power within the grasp of the Jews as a people.
