Washington News.

WASHINGTON, 2.—The course of

Inspector Pollock continues to ex-

cite comment in official circles.

Acting Secretary Joslyn said that

Pollock, in publishing his report in

the newspapers of his investigation

of McClelland, of Pine Ridge

agency, had treated his superiors

with the utmost disrespect, and he

should not complain of the conse-

quences. He added that Pollock's

report had been in the possession of
