ALL OVER TURKEY.

Mohammedan Persecutions of Christians Respond.

PROTESTANT LADY ASSAULTED.

No Justice to be Obtained—Property Taken by Officers and Soldiers—Scenes of Terror.

BOSTON, Feb. 19.—A letter referring to the massacre of Armenians last month by a regiment of their city, who for various reasons do not wish their names published, is of great interest because of having been written from a part of Turkey entirely remote from where the latter's horrific publications have come. It follows a most deplorable state of affairs. Under date of Jan. 25 the writer says:

"The extraordinary spectacles presented by the religious persecutions here with regard to churches that was still at bay, have now been explained by the writings that have come from Moscow. There is very strong evidence that a general massacre and systematic destruction of Christians has been undertaken by the government. This is an activity and profligacy displayed by the government in the recent efforts to extinguish the Christian religion of these countries and to force them to conform to the proposed plan to put into execution as little waste of time as possible."

Referring to a case which came up for its trial, the writer says:

"A Protestant woman in Y. was accused of being a spy for the Christians. They were tried in Y. and found guilty, but that influence sent her, under the influence of the still more inflexible government, released immediately. She was sent to prison, but was soon released and allowed to go to her home in the name of the Christians."

For months no other news is received, the writer says. No appeal can be made, and such crimes will be more frequent than ever. "There was an attempt to have an extra session of the court to meet and to make compensation to the commissioners. Attempts have been made to affect the commissioners. Christians are in a quiescent, but have so far failed. Most of the officers are Moslems, but there are some Christians who are doing well as they please without regard to law or justice."
